IMPORTANT NOTICES TO HORSE EXHIBITORS

Stabling

Stabling contractors - Cheval Starbox Ltd.

Exhibitors requiring Horse Stabling must notify their requirements **AT THE TIME OF ENTRY**.

Stabling will only be available on the night before / day of showing. All exhibitors must vacate stables by 6.00pm unless they have reserved the stable for other nights.

Please note that stables are NON-TRANSFERABLE.

Any exhibitor may book stabling if desired and pay £44.00 per stable, per night, to include straw. The proviso is that if stables are oversubscribed the Association reserves the right to restrict the booking of stables for those exhibitors only showing on one day. The horse stables are available for the following times, bookings for Wednesday night, stables are available from 8am on the Wednesday until 6pm on the Thursday. For Thursday night bookings, stables are available from 6pm on the Thursday until 6pm on the Friday. For Friday night bookings, stables are available from 6pm on the Friday until classes have finished on the Saturday.

Equine Passports

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitors to bring their Horse Passports with them to the Show. Random spot checks are likely to be undertaken by enforcing agencies and if Veterinary medical treatment may be required.

Exhibitors' attention is drawn to Rule 9 of the Bye-Laws and Regulations and the amended wording reference 'Suitably Mounted'.

Horse Lorry Arrivals

All horse exhibitors, except those who have been provided with an inside parking pass are to arrive through the outer horse lorry entrance in the field adjacent to the Showground, from there you will be parked accordingly. With limited inside parking space we cannot guarantee parking inside of the Showground.

Caravans

Exhibitors bringing their caravan to the Show **must place it in the Livestock Caravan Park** at a fee of £60.00 for the week. Applications for passes should be made to the Equine Team. **For the safety and security of all Exhibitors and their animals**

NO tents and/or gazebos are permitted within the Horse Lorry parking areas.

Passes

The following passes will be allocated to all horse exhibitors, any additional passes required must be purchased alongside your entries, and tickets will be sent out together with your entry information.

One entry: 2 x One Day Tickets

Two or more entries: One additional Day Ticket for each extra entry

The judging of any class may be advanced by 15 minutes ahead of the time shown in the programme.

Qualifier and Day Ticket Information

Agria Royal International Horse Show Qualifying, 22 – 27 July 2025

The following classes are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show: 4 - 8, 10, 15 - 21, 169 & 171.

Competitors qualifying at this show for the Agria Royal International Horse Show must submit their entries **ONLINE** at: hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling/the-agria-royal-international-horse-show/

Horse of the Year Show Qualifying

Class 9 is a qualifying event for this year's Horse of the Year Show, NEC Birmingham 8 - 12 October 2025. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward. No Horse lower than third place will qualify. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show Office.

Class 9 will be run in accordance with the general notes set out in the Horse of the Year Show Rule Book, a copy of which can be downloaded from hoys.co.uk. Included in the entry fee is an £18 contribution to Horse of the Year Show.

Irish Draught Horse Society (GB)

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) therefore horses entering classes 4-10, 15, 16, 19 – 21, 22-24 and 45 are only eligible to qualify for the National Championship show, which is taking place at Onley Equestrian Centre on 6 and 7 September 2025, if they meet the following eligibility criteria:-

All horses must be registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct Ownership

NEW: Owners of Pure Bred Irish Draughts and Irish Draught Part-Bred / Sport Horses must now be full members of the IDHS (GB) to compete

Irish Draught Part-Bred / Sports Horses must have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding

Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by experienced rider/handlers over 18 years of age

Ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

For Classes 22 – 24 & 45, the following criteria also applies:-

MARES with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)

Pure Bred ID and ID Part-Bred, 3 year old colts must be un-inspected

All 1, 2 & 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by experienced handlers over 18 years of age

All Pure Bred youngstock (Yearling, 2 and 3 year olds) must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.

All qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS (GB) Show Affiliation Team to invite them to the final.

Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge

The following classes are qualifiers for the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge: 4 - 10, 15, 16, 19 - 21. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from the above mentioned classes will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 6 & 7 September 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire, CV23 8AJ. A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.

In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, and a trophy, the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500, and

3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure-Bred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50.

The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge and IDHS (GB) Sport Horse Youngstock Challenge

This show is a Qualifier for both the Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge and the IDHS (GB) Sport Horse Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed pure and part-bred horses from each age group that have not already qualified in Classes 22 – 24 & 45, will qualify to go forward to the final, which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 6 & 7 September 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.

SHB (GB) Day Tickets

If you are not a member of SHB (GB) then a SHB (GB) Day Ticket is required to compete at this Show at a cost of £42 in the following SHB (GB) classes: 1 & 4 – 8 (the Day Ticket entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year at £42 per show, it covers owner and rider SHB (GB) membership together with horse registration for that show). If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider SHB (GB) membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB (GB) office within 14 days.

BSHA Day Tickets

If you are not a member of the BSHA then a BSHA Day Ticket is required to compete in the following BSHA classes: 10, 31 - 34 & 50 - 53.

Competitors and Horses need to be registered or have temporary BSHA membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form. DAY TICKETS: BSHA Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per horse, per season. **A Day Ticket will not allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes (they are permitted for Working Show Horse RIHS qualifiers, but appropriate BSHA membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier in order to confirm registration).** Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height Certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket via the BSHA website.

Hunter Brood Mares Premium Awards

Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain offers one Premium in the following classes: 25 & 27.

The Society offers Brood Mare Premiums at selected affiliated shows, but premiums will only be awarded if there are a minimum of three mares forward per class. The premium takes the form of a Service Voucher, the value of which is to be determined from time to time by the Society, awarded at the Judge's discretion to their selection from the monetary prize winners, to be used towards the cost of covering the mare by any SHB (GB) Graded Stallion or Life Approved Premium Stallion that is properly registered for the year of covering. The Service Voucher may be used in either of the two years following the year of that award. The owner must be, or become, a fully paid-up member of SHB(GB) to be eligible for the award. No mare shall take more than one award per year.

The Langaller Farm Brood Mare Premium Award

Entries within the following classes are eligible for this award: 25, 27, 32, 37 & 42.

This takes the form of a rosette and a voucher worth £75 to be awarded to the highest placed Brood Mare in the above mentioned classes and is redeemable against any stud fee for a stallion standing at Langaller Farm during the current or following stud season. Only one award per mare per season. Where the winning mare has already won a voucher in the current year the award goes to the next highest placed eligible mare. Mr Charles Upham, Langaller Farm, Bovey Tracey, Devon.

The Queen Elizabeth II Perpetual Challenge Cup for the Best Light Horse in the Show - this will be judged on the First Day at 2.00pm in Ring Two.

Horses to qualify are: Champion of Classes 1 - 3, Champion Ridden Hunter, Winner of Ladies Hunter, Champion Riding Horse, Champion Ridden Hack, Champion Ridden Cob, Winner of Maxi Cob, Champion Hunter Brood Mare & Youngstock, Champion Small Hunter Brood Mare & Youngstock, Champion Riding Horse Brood Mare & Youngstock and Champion Sport Horse Brood Mare & Youngstock.

The Price Family Supreme In-Hand Championship & Royal Cornwall In-Hand Championship - judged on the Second Day at 1.30pm in Ring Two.

Champion Hunter Brood Mare & Youngstock, Champion Small Hunter Brood Mare & Youngstock, Champion Riding Horse Brood Mare & Youngstock and Champion Sport Horse Brood Mare & Youngstock must remain until the Second Day if they wish to compete for the The Price Family Supreme In-Hand Championship & Royal Cornwall In-Hand Championship. Stabling will be found for those who have to stay on payment of £44.00 per stable to include straw.

Rosettes

Rosettes will be awarded in all classes from 1st to 5th place, in addition, a 6th prize rosette will be awarded in classes with at least 10 entries forward on the day. Please note that this does not affect the cash prizes as listed.

- Judging to commence at 8.00am in **RING TWO** on the **FIRST DAY** of the Show.
- Horses entered in Classes 1 - 7 are to be ridden.
- Classes 1 & 4 - 7 are under Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules, **SHB(GB) Day Tickets are required to compete in these Classes, if not a member of SHB(GB).**
- Entries in Class 1 need only be on the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Basic Identity Record or Stud Book, owners and riders must be Members.
- Entries in Class 2 need a Certificate/Letter signed by a Master of Hounds.**
- Agria Royal International Horse Show Qualifying Classes (Classes 4 - 7). The two highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight and Small Classes will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second can qualify.
- Animals in ridden height restricted classes (Class 4) **will not** be required to be in possession of a JMB Height Certificate or verification of measurement to compete in RIHS or HOYS Qualifiers. However, qualifying animals will need to be measured **within 28 days of qualification or before the final, whichever is sooner.** The valid JMB full height certificate or a valid JMB annual height certificate must be submitted to the SHB(GB) office on receipt from the JMB and prior to competing at RIHS or HOYS. There are **no** exceptions to this rule.
- Entries in Classes 4 - 7 must be registered on the current year Show Hunter Register. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society or compete on a Day Ticket.
- Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse Classes.
- Classes 5 - 7 are also qualifying classes for the SHB(GB) Supreme Ridden Hunter Championship to be held at The National Supreme Hunter Championship 12th-13th August 2025. Horses placed 1st to 3rd in each section will qualify.
- Classes 4, 5, 6 & 7 are Qualifiers for the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge.
- Classes 1 - 7 will be part of the Healthiest Body Condition Awards, an initiative run by the Horse Trust. Rosettes will be awarded in each class judged by Mr A Todd of Kernow Farm & Equine Vets. For further information please visit horsetrust.org.uk

OR, not having been placed 1-9 in ANY CLASS (excepting Working, Ladies and Search for a Star) at The Royal International Horse Show OR Horse of the Year Show before 1st January in the current year. A Novice may be shown in a snaffle bridle. Horses entered in these classes must be registered (passported or overstamped) with SHB(GB) and owners and riders must be members of SHB(GB), or compete on a Day Ticket. A SHB(GB) special award will be made to the highest placed 4 year old in this class. Additional Prizes of £8, £6, £3 will be awarded to the three highest placed horses, owned and bred by the Exhibitor who is a bona fide resident Cornish farmer. **Exhibitors who wish their horse to be considered for this competition should wear a white armband.** Horses entered in this Class may also be entered in Classes 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 if eligible.
- Regularly Hunted, Mare or Gelding**, exceeding 14.2 h.h., that has been regularly Hunted (in excess of 10 times) with a recognised Hunt in the current season, that is the property of either the Master(s), or a Member, Subscriber or Farmer of the Hunt. Additional Prizes of £8, £6, £3 will be awarded to the three highest placed horses, owned and bred by the Exhibitor who is a bona fide resident Cornish farmer. **Exhibitors who wish their horse to be considered for this competition should wear a white armband.** ***A certificate/letter signed by a Master of Hounds must accompany the entry form.**

- Local Show Hunter, Mare or Gelding**, 4 years old & over, owned by Exhibitor, resident in Cornwall.

- Heavyweight Show Hunter, Mare or Gelding**, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2 h.h. approx.) and capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone).

- The condition of the feet.

General

Risk and Responsibility

1. The entire risk and responsibility as regards all Exhibits both whilst at the Show and during transit and all consequential or other injury or loss arising therefrom must be wholly borne by the Exhibitor.

Compensation

2. The Association will not be in any way liable or responsible to any Exhibitor, Purchaser, Stockperson, Attendant or Visitor for any claim or loss or injury or compensation occasioned by or arising out of the holding of their Shows or by reason of the act or default of any Exhibitor, Purchaser, Visitor, Stockperson, or other person in attendance or present thereat nor will the Association be liable or responsible to any such person if for any reason the Show in any particular year or years is abandoned or the period of its advertised duration curtailed.

Accidents

3. The Association will not be responsible for any accident that may be occasioned by or occur from any Machinery or other Article belonging to any Exhibitor and it is a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Association harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any accident caused by their Machinery or other Exhibit or arising in any way from or out of the Exhibition of their property.

Disclaimer of Liability

4. In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Council, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Council, its servants or agents, the Council will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or their stockperson or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought onto the Showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises. No Stock, Produce or other competing Entry will be admitted for exhibition unless the necessary Entry Form, properly filled in, complying in every respect with the regulations of the Prize Schedule, signed by the Exhibitor or their authorised Agent and accompanied by the necessary fees, shall have been delivered to the Livestock & Equine Team at the Showground Office, on or before the date appointed for the closing of the entries.

The same exhibit may be entered in more than one class, when eligible, on payment of a separate entry fee for each class at the time of entry and only exhibits actually exhibited in their Class are eligible for any Special Prizes, if relevant.

HORSE, CATTLE & PIG EXHIBITORS MAY ONLY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF THREE ANIMALS IN ANY ONE CLASS, SHEEP EXHIBITORS MAY ONLY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF TWO ANIMALS IN ANY ONE CLASS.

Only Members of the Association are allowed to exhibit at Members' Rate and the Membership Subscription for the current year as well as any arrears must be paid before entries can be accepted.

Every Exhibitor or Competitor will be held responsible for the correctness of their entry. If, when called upon to prove its correctness, they fail to do so, the entry in question will not be accepted or if already accepted, may be cancelled or the exhibit may be disqualified and any Award made to it cancelled and furthermore all Awards made to such an Exhibitor or Competitor in any class may be cancelled.

All persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal of a class covered by a Breed Society either to which the Association is affiliated or which is affiliated to the Association shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including disciplinary procedures) insofar as they are applicable to any event, competition or display promoted or arranged by the Association.

The Association would deem the Breed Societies to be responsible for the enforcement of their own Breed Society rules.

The Association reserves the right to publish all names and addresses of all exhibitors in the official catalogue and share such information with breed societies and other similar bodies in connection with the staging of the equine and livestock sections.

The Association accepts no responsibility if for any reason, any event or events, for which exhibitors qualify at the Royal Cornwall Show, are not staged.

Entry fees shall not be returnable except in the following cases:

(a) they will be refunded in the event of cancellation of classes or a DEFRA Order prohibiting the exhibition of animals at the Royal Cornwall Show.

(b) in the case of an animal incapacitated by accident, injury or illness. Any claim under this clause must be made in writing to the Secretary and must be accompanied by a certificate issued by a Veterinary Surgeon and to be received not later than **23 MAY 2025** together with all stickers and passes issued in respect of the entry/ies in question. **ANY CLAIM RECEIVED AFTER 23 MAY 2025 WILL BE INVALID.**

The entry fee is not returnable to an Exhibitor who enters an Animal in a class for which it is ineligible or not registered.

Closing of Entries

8. The last day on which entries can be accepted is **13 April**, except for the Jumping Competitions, entries for which may be made up to and including **4 May** if stabling required or **18 May** if no stabling required.

Exhibitors and Their Stockpersons / Grooms

9. All Exhibitors and Their Stockpersons / Grooms shall be subject to the Orders and Rules of the Council or Officials appointed by the Council. The Council reserves the right to ban from exhibiting, either in person or through a nominee or agent, any exhibitor (or their stockperson / groom), who, in the opinion of the Council, contravenes or has contravened any of the Association's Bye-Laws, Regulations or anyone infringing the Regulations and Conditions of the Association and who behaves noisily or offensively to the Judges or Officials is liable to be disqualified and any award cancelled and, furthermore all awards made to such an Exhibitor or Competitor in any class may be cancelled, and such person shall thereupon be excluded from exhibiting in this Association during the pleasure of the Council. Such matters will be determined by a Council as detailed in regulation 12. The Council reserves to itself the right to inform other Agricultural Associations or Breed or other Societies of any decision it may come to with respect to any exhibitor.

Stockpersons / Grooms appearing with animals in judging rings must be of smart appearance and dressed appropriately for the section being judged. It is the Exhibitors responsibility to ensure that the correct number is worn in the relevant class and the Association accepts no responsibility for errors caused by incorrect numbers being displayed.

All Exhibitors must have the physical ability, relevant experience and be competent to handle the animal they are in charge of at all times. Handlers must be properly trained in safe work methods and be in good health. Judges / Stewards are empowered to ask an exhibitor to leave a ring or any other area on the grounds of safety if they feel that the exhibitor is incapable of safely handling / riding the exhibit in question.

Horses/Ponies should not be tied to the railings or left unattended at any time.

Suitably Mounted: All animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry parks (day or night), must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

All stock handlers, and especially children, should only handle animals where they have the necessary experience and strength

to cope with that animal.

NO CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF 7 YEARS IS ALLOWED INTO THE CATTLE JUDGING RINGS. For the Main Ring Parade a child must be 10 years and over to lead a calf up to 3 months and be accompanied by an adult. For all other cattle, handlers must be 16 years and over. A sheep handler must be capable of handling the animal, at the Stewards discretion.

All Bulls over 12 months of age must be accompanied by 2 people.

It is strongly recommended that children other than those stipulated above do not enter the main ring or livestock walk at the time of the parades.

The administration of any pharmaceutical substance is prohibited by any Exhibitor and can only be carried out by one of the Association's Veterinary Officers.

Animal Welfare - The Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.

Awards

10. Only the signed awards of the Judges are accepted by the Association as evidence that a prize has been awarded and the production of a prize card or rosette by an exhibitor will not entitle them to the Prize. All Cups and Trophies must be signed for prior to their collection. A Trophy that can be won outright i.e. after being won 3 times in succession or any 4 times etc., can only be so won if the exhibitors name or combination of names on the Entry Form is the same for each relevant year of entry.

Inter-Breed Awards for Cattle Championships and Special Prizes will only be judged from the Breed Winners (2nd prize winners will not be eligible).

Penalties

11. As the non-exhibition of Animals entered for the Show causes unnecessary preparation and expense and disarranges the Showground, any person entering Stock and failing to exhibit shall pay a penalty of £5.00 for each entry unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or their authorised Agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Association before the day of the Exhibition certifying that non-exhibition is caused by:

- (1) the death of the animal or animals
- (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a Veterinary Surgeon) or
- (3) it's becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered.

Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Association against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Association's Showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the Showground and in addition the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Association in connection with any such claim. The Association's Veterinary Officers are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to, or to have removed from, the Showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease or with disease which, in their opinion, was likely to prove dangerous to other animals. The owner or stockperson in charge of such animal may obtain, if desired, a certificate in writing from the Association's Veterinary Officer, stating the nature of such disease or infection. Concealment of disease will render the exhibitor liable to disqualification in accordance with regulation 9.

The Stewards, on the recommendation of the Association's Veterinary Officers shall have the power to remove from the Showground any unruly, vicious, deformed or diseased animals, and also the stock, implements or miscellaneous articles belonging to any exhibitor who refuses to comply with the instructions given to them by the Stewards without any responsibility attaching to them or to the Association in consequence of such removal.

Protests

12. All objections must be lodged, in writing, with the Secretary not later than five o'clock in the afternoon of the day on which the award affected has been made. If, however the protest applies to fraudulent entry or description, it will be accepted if made within seven days of the closing day of the Show. The Objector must state the specific grounds on which the objection is made and at the same time deposit a sum of £30 with the Secretary. Protests involving measurement certificates must be dealt with in accordance with the rules of Joint Measurements Scheme and the requisite deposit lodged at the same time.

All objections will be considered by a Council, normally chaired by the Director of Showyard and consisting of not less than three other members of Council, one of whom should, if possible, be a steward of the section affected. The Council may require and receive such evidence as they think fit and in particular may require the objector or the exhibitor of any animal in respect of which such a protest was lodged to make a statutory declaration upon any question of fact concerning the matters of such objection. The decision of the Council who determine the objection shall be final and binding and the objector shall, by lodging the objection, be taken to agree that such decisions shall be final and binding upon them and that no appeal therefrom shall lie upon any ground whatever. If the objection is determined against the objector their deposit shall be forfeited unless in the opinion of the Council when determining the objection, when they may then order the return of the deposit. If the objection be determined against the objector they may also be liable to the Society for the amount of costs and expenses occasioned by the objection and the determination thereof, unless in the opinion of the Council who determine the objection there existed good and reasonable ground for objection, when they may order to the contrary.

Adjudication of Prizes

13. In awarding the Prizes to **Cattle, Sheep and Pigs**, the Judges are particularly instructed not to take into consideration the present value to the **Butcher** of the animal exhibited, but to decide according to their relative merit for the purpose of **Breeding** (this does not apply to any Commercial Sections). They are also instructed to take into consideration the relative age of the different animals in each class.

The Judges may withhold any prize where there is evident want of merit. Where there is only one Exhibit or pen of Exhibits shown in a Class the Judges may award the first, second or third prize according to the merit of the Exhibit or Exhibits exhibited.

The Judges are instructed to select a reserve exhibit in each class, provided there is sufficient merit, in case an exhibit to which a prize has been awarded shall be disqualified.

No **Exhibitor** or other person, except the Stewards will be allowed to go near the Judges while making the awards.

Arrival and Departure of Exhibitors and behaviour whilst at the Show

14. The Showground will be open for the reception of **Cattle, Sheep and Pigs** at the following times;

Tuesday, 3 June, from 10.00 am until 9.00 pm (other than British Native & Traditional Rare Breed Sheep who may only arrive on Wednesday 4 June, unless prior permission is given by the Secretary).

Wednesday, 4 June, from 8.00 am until 7.00 pm for Cattle, Sheep & Pigs

The above deadlines must be adhered to by all livestock exhibitors. If this is not the case Exhibitors run the risk of not being permitted to exhibit.

Livestock are NOT permitted to arrive on the first morning of the show.

The horse lorry parking area will be open for the reception of **Horses / Ponies** from 8.00 am on **Wednesday 4 June**.

All horse exhibitors, except those who have been provided with an inside parking pass are to arrive through the outer horse lorry entrance in the field adjacent to the Showground, from there you will be parked accordingly. With limited inside parking space we cannot guarantee parking inside of the Showground.

All Cattle, Sheep and Pigs are to remain on the Showground until after the Grand Parade in the afternoon of the last day of the Show and shall under no circumstances be taken out of their places in the interval without the special permission of the Director of Showyard or Secretary.

During the time the Show is open to the public no Rug or Cloth shall be hung so as to conceal any Animal except with the special permission of the Steward of the Department.

No person shall be allowed to fix any Card or Placard in the Showground without the written permission of the Secretary.

Stockpersons in charge of Stock at night must, if they leave the Showground, return before midnight or they will not be admitted.

All persons in charge of exhibits will be subject to the orders of the Stewards and will be required to parade or exhibit the animals in their charge at such times as may be directed by the Stewards. Stewards have the right to exclude from the Judging Rings and/or the Showground any animal which is vicious or unruly. Stockpersons must be in attendance each day during the Show at least a quarter of an hour before the time appointed for exhibiting the Animals under their charge in the Show Rings. Stockpersons in charge of Animals must see that the Boxes or Stalls are kept clean. No cooking stove or barbecue of any description may be lighted in the Boxes or Stalls within and adjacent to the Cattle Halls. The Cattle Halls and Sheep Marquees will be NO SMOKING Areas, anyone offending in this respect will be dealt with in such a manner as shall be determined by the Council. With respect to all Exhibitors and their animals the playing of music in the Cattle Halls, Sheep Marquee, Pig Lines and all Horse Areas is not to be excessively loud and all music must be turned off by 10.30pm. Owners of the Animals exhibited will be held responsible for the behaviour of their Stockpersons and for the consequences of any misconduct of such Stockpersons.

Exhibitor numbers will be forwarded by the Livestock & Equine Team to every Horse Exhibitor. Cattle, Sheep and Pig neck numbers should be collected from the relevant Stewards Office as directed.

No Exhibitor or their Stockperson must in any way inappropriately interfere with exhibits other than their own.

Tampering and Malpractice

15. Any artificial contrivance or device of any description found on or proved to have been used on an animal at any time whilst that animal is in the Showground, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purpose, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize, and any prize awarded prior to discovery will be forfeited. The Instigator or The Owner of the said animal may be prohibited from again entering Stock for any of the Association's Shows, for such period as the Council may see fit. For the purpose of this Regulation, the term 'improper practice' shall be held to include setting of teats, and generally any other practice including tampering of their own or any other animal by the exhibitor or any other person which results in the animals being shown other than in a natural state, and the Association reserves the right to have all animals inspected by the Association's Veterinary Officers, either prior to, during, or after judging.

The overstocking of udders is to be strongly discouraged and exhibitors are liable to inspection by the Association's Veterinary Officers.

The Association will not tolerate the administration to show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question to have the effect of making it behave in the show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Association reserves the right to take any necessary samples. Any Person or Exhibitor (or their representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquilliser or drugs to any Show exhibit will be reported to the Council, and dealt with at their discretion. In addition the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

The following practices and/or procedures are prohibited when showing any animal, with many of the following relating specifically to dairy cattle:

- Filling an animal's rumen unnaturally with liquid (tubing).
- Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
- Treating the udder internally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation.
- Treating the udder externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation. (Allowable practices / substances include the use of external anti-inflammatory substances for the well-being of the animal).
- Causing any unlicensed substance to be entered inside the teat orifice.
- The setting or sealing of teats with any substance.
- Roping udders and the use of objects to physically improve definition of the suspensory central ligament.

- Administering epidural anaesthesia (blocking tails) and/or applying any irritant either externally or internally to the perineal (rectum and vagina) area.
- Inserting foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline (including hair not attached to its own hair follicle) or on the feet (administration of prescribed medications, and false switches and tails is permitted).
- Performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. (the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves is allowed).
- Wrapping hocks or draining fluid from hocks unless authorised by a veterinarian at the show;
- Attaching an appliance to an animal other than for milking.
- Criticising or interfering with any or all of the individuals involved in the organisation and judging of the Show (including the judge, show management or other exhibitors) or any other conduct detrimental to the breed or Show.
- The wearing of shackles.
- Any other practices which in the reasonable opinion of the Association causes unnecessary suffering to an animal, unfairly improves its performance in a Show, or otherwise undermines or interferes with the integrity of the Show, or brings the show or the Society into disrepute.

Please note: Scanning of the mammary system for all first and second prize winning dairy cattle from Thursday's inspection classes will take place immediately after the completion of each judging class. Such Exhibitors will be directed by Association Stewards to the relevant area for this to be carried out by the Association's Veterinary Team.

If any Exhibitor observes any concerning activity as outlined above, please contact the veterinary team immediately to report your observations, so that the Association veterinary team can investigate the activity in question at the time it is taking place.

Any Exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection, having reference to Livestock exhibited at this Show, must make the same in accordance with the objection requirements (Rule 12) of the Association. If, on investigation, the objection is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Council, the sum thus deposited shall, at the discretion of the Council, be forfeited to the funds of the Association. All objections must be lodged on the same day as the alleged incident occurred in accordance with the objection regulations, and no objection will be SUBSEQUENTLY received, unless a reason, satisfactory to the Council be assigned for the delay.

Regulations Applying to Certain Classes

The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

HORSES

16. All Horses entered in Classes with conditions as to height may be measured before being judged, with their Shoes on and no subsequent alteration of Shoes will be permitted.

The decision to ride Horses in any Ridden Class is solely at the discretion of the Judge.

No horse may be exercised other than in a collecting ring.

No horse should be left unattended other than when securely contained within a horse vehicle or stable.

Horses/Ponies should not be tied to the railings or left unattended at any time.

Animals winning Prizes offered by the Hunters' Improvement and Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain, must undergo veterinary examination if required.

Exhibitors wishing to be supplied with horse boxes must apply on or before **13 April**, paying the additional fees for each box, i.e., £44.00 per night to include straw. The proviso is that if boxes are oversubscribed the Association reserves the right to restrict the booking of stables for those exhibitors only showing on one day. Please note: **Stabling will only be available on the night before / day of showing. Please note that stables are NON-TRANSFERABLE.**

Anyone riding a horse when jumping in the Ring, practice or collecting areas, must wear protective headgear according to the current standards as listed below (see special note below for Morgan classes). All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap secured and correctly fastened at all times. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. Any variation to this ruling is solely at the exhibitors' risk. Morgan Exhibitors are advised by their Society to wear approved hats (PAS 015 at least) but if they wish to wear straw hats during the judging of their classes it is at their own risk.

Equine Influenza - Equine Influenza vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all equines (horses and ponies) attending the Royal Cornwall Show and random spot checks of passports are likely to be undertaken. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

No Exhibitor or their groom may ride one horse and lead another or if on foot lead more than one horse. The bringing of companion horses/ponies is strongly discouraged but if such animals are present their behaviour and all matters relating to safety are the sole responsibility of the exhibitor bringing such animals to the show. Anyone exhibiting a stallion must take adequate precautions to ensure the safety of other people and animals.

Suitably Mounted - All animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry parks (day or night), must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

EXHIBITORS MAY ONLY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF THREE ANIMALS IN ANY ONE CLASS.

Measuring of Horses

Entries in Classes with height conditions may be subject to measuring should a query arise, and will be measured by the Association's Veterinary Surgeons in the Measuring Box in the Stabling Area. Owners/Exhibitors of horses/ponies which have been issued with an Official Height Certificate by the Joint Measuring Scheme should have this Height Certificate at the Show either printed off or on a mobile device which can be easily accessed if needed. Half an inch to be allowed for normal shoes, no allowances for tips, plates or Charlier shoes. No subsequent alterations to shoes permitted.

SHOWJUMPING

All competitors must wear uniform or hunting costume or appropriate hats and coats. Failure to comply may involve elimination. All competitors must wear a protective helmet manufactured to the current approved BSI or European Standard. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap correctly and securely fastened at all times. Any variation to this ruling is solely at the exhibitors' risk.

The use of helmet mounted cameras at British Showjumping Events is not allowed.

No horse may be exercised other than in a collecting ring.

No horse should be left unattended other than when securely contained within a horse vehicle or stable.

No member shall allow a stallion for which they are responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete, in any showjumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.

The Association reserves the right to restrict the number of entries in any class.

During Jumping Competitions, three Competitors must always be ready to enter the Ring. If a Competitor does not respond when their 'Order Number' is called, they lose their turn and the Horse bearing the Number called may be eliminated.

There will be a time limit for all Jumping Competitions. The time limit for each competition will be announced before the competition starts.

Automatic timing apparatus will be in operation.

Exhibitors wishing to be supplied with horse boxes must apply on or before **4 May**, paying the additional fees for each box, i.e., £44.00 per night to include straw. The proviso is that if boxes are oversubscribed the Association reserves the right to restrict the booking of stables for those exhibitors only showing on one day.

Stables will not be refunded if late withdrawal of horses.

Please note: **Stabling will only be available on the night before / day of showing. Please note that stables are NON-TRANSFERABLE.**

CATTLE

17. At the date of entry cattle must be from herds which are free from restrictions imposed under (a) The Tuberculosis Order 1984; and (b) The Brucellosis Orders.

In addition the entered animals must not themselves be under individual restrictions.

An animal accepted for entry must not be consigned to the Royal Cornwall Show if, after entry, either it or the herd to which it belongs becomes subject to movement restrictions.

BVD Testing: All cattle attending the 2025 Royal Cornwall Show **MUST** reside in a herd which has been tested as part of a recognised BVD eradication programme or to have been individually tested for BVD antigen with a negative result. Individual BVD antigen results may be obtained via blood sampling or tissue tagging. Proof of testing and negative status will be required when animals arrive at the show. For those cattle keepers using herd status to demonstrate BVD freedom, antibody results must not be older than 12 months before the date of arrival at the show.

The Association reserves the right to take blood samples from any animal exhibited.

Any animal which shows evidence of ringworm should not be sent to the Show. Any animal found to be affected will, on the Certificate of the Association's Veterinary Officers, be disqualified from competition and must be removed from the Showground. The exhibitor of such animals will be subject to a fine not exceeding £25 per affected animal.

All cattle must be from Herds which are Officially Brucellosis Free. (NB from 1 October 1985 all herds were re-designated to be OBF Status).

The Warble Fly (England and Wales) Order 1982, as amended.

Any Cattle which are affected with warble fly larvae are subject to movement restrictions. Such affected cattle may only be lawfully moved if accompanied by a declaration of treatment (Form C - Yellow). Affected animals, not accompanied by a declaration of treatment (Form C) detected in the Showground will be licensed home.

The Exhibitors of Bulls, Cows and Heifers shall certify as to the purity of Breeds and eligibility for the respective Herd Books.

All cows shall have had a fully developed Calf within six months of the Exhibition or shall be in-calf at the time of the Exhibition and in the case of both Cows and Heifers exhibited as being in-calf, the prizes will not be paid to the Exhibitor of any in-calf Cow or Heifer not in-milk, until such time as the animal has been certified to have produced a fully developed calf.

Animals which calve or show evidence of calving whilst at the Showground must be placed in the isolation accommodation pending their possible early removal from the Showground.

Where an animal calves at full term, and the owner arranges for a blood sample and vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and Rose Bengal Plate Test (RBPT) and a microscopical examination of a smear made from the vaginal swab are negative, the animal may return to the Show lines at the discretion of the Show Secretary.

Where an animal calves prematurely or aborts, the DVO must be informed immediately. The animal must be returned home TOGETHER WITH ALL OTHER SHOW ANIMALS FROM THE SAME REGISTERED PREMISES after a full range of samples has been taken. The suspect animal must be isolated during transit.

If, whilst in the Showground a cow calves either at full term or prematurely or aborts or show signs of aborting and the Exhibitor or their Stockpersons fails to inform the Association's Veterinary Surgeons, that Exhibitor, if proved to have infringed this regulation will be liable, at the discretion of the Council of the Association to a LIFE-TIME BAN from exhibiting at any future shows held by the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association.

All Cattle must be properly secured to the satisfaction of the Officials of the Association on being brought to the entrance of the Showground or they may not be admitted. Whilst stalled at the show it is suggested that all cattle are double tied.

Livestock must be under the control of a competent handler at all times and they must use approved restraints which are safe and fit for purpose. Movements on the showground include areas used by the public and also when going from the Exhibition Halls to the judging rings and handlers must ensure adequate safeguards are in place to prevent an animal from escaping.

All Bulls over 10 months old must have a permanent ring attached to the nose and must be provided with a strong chain or rope and to be led. Use of the bulldog can be used for younger cattle, if felt appropriate.

The Dams of All Bulls (Dairy Breeds) entered for the Inspection Classes must be qualified in accordance with the requirements of the respective Breed Society.

Tampering and Malpractice - see Rule 15.

The exercising of cattle within the cattle judging rings prior to the start of judging on the first day is prohibited.

Pressure Hoses: Only low pressure hoses can be used for washing of cattle. Pressure above 30psi will not be permitted. The use of power hoses producing water above 30psi is banned.

Electrical safety: The correct maintenance and safe use of any electrical equipment brought to the show is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor, both for their own safety and of any third party. It is highly recommended that electrical equipment is regularly PAT tested.

EXHIBITORS MAY ONLY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF THREE ANIMALS IN ANY ONE CLASS.

NO EXHIBITOR MAY BE PERMITTED TO EXHIBIT MORE THAN TWO ANIMALS PER CLASS WHICH WERE THE RESULT OF AN EMBRYO TRANSFER FROM THE SAME PARENTAGE.

Within the 'Any Other Pure Breed' Sections, if over 12 entries are received for any one breed and from at least 3 different Exhibitors, Breed Classes will be formed and a Specialist Judge appointed for the 2025 Show. If 10 or more entries are forward at the Show, Breed Classes will automatically be staged for 2026. If less than 10 entries are forward, the Breed will revert back to the Any Other Pure Breed Section for 2026.

Within the Breed Sections, if less than 10 entries are forward, the Association is likely to discontinue the classes for the following year and entries would only then be eligible for the 'Any Other Pure Breed' Section.

SHEEP

18. Each pen of Ewes must be of the same Flock.

All lambs must be born on or after 1 December 2024 unless otherwise stated, or individual Breed Society Rules state differently.

All ewes, 2 shear or over, to have reared a lamb(s) in the year of the Show.

All sheep being shown must be on halters, if applicable, but must be on halters to be paraded.

All sheep brought into the Showground must have been dipped and moved in accordance with any Ministry Regulations in force at that time.

Exhibitors are specially cautioned not to send to the Show animals which are suffering from Orf in any stage. Any animal found to be affected, will, on the advice of the Show Veterinary Officers, be disqualified from competition and removed from the Show.

Current legislation (the Mutilation (Permitted Procedures) (England) Regulations 2007 Schedule 5.5) requires that sheep must have sufficient tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of the male sheep. Sheep entered for the 2025 Royal Cornwall Show are liable to be inspected in the lines by the Association's Veterinary Officers or other appropriate official bodies. Any sheep which do not comply with the aforementioned regulation will not be eligible to be shown.

The spraying of sheep with any substances is forbidden within the Sheep Marquee.

Electrical safety: The correct maintenance and safe use of any electrical equipment brought to the show is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor, both for their own safety and of any third party. It is highly recommended that electrical equipment is regularly PAT tested.

Within the 'Any Other Pure Breed' Sections, if over 25 entries are received for any one breed and from at least 3 different Exhibitors, Breed Classes will be formed and a Specialist Judge appointed for the 2025 Show. If 20 or more entries are forward at the Show, Breed Classes will automatically be staged for 2026. If less than 20 entries are forward, the Breed will revert back to the Any Other Pure Breed Section for 2026.

Within the Breed Sections, if less than 20 entries are forward, the Association is likely to discontinue the classes for the following year and entries would only then be eligible for the 'Any Other Pure Breed' Section.

Maedi-Visna accredited and **Scrapie Monitored** accommodation will only be provided for sheep which have been signified as being of such status on the entry form. In order to be admitted to the accredited accommodation, all **Maedi-Visna** accredited sheep must be accompanied by the appropriate **SAC Form (green)** - **within expiry date**. **Scrapie Monitored** sheep will be accommodated and shown in **unsegregated** conditions.

All female sheep, whether scrapie monitored or not, of all breeds except Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace must, at the time of the show be

- a). non-pregnant (empty),
- b). have not lambed within 30 days prior to arrival at the show and
- c). not be subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern.

All females of the Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace breeds and animals subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern must be accompanied to the show by a declaration for each animal confirming that the sheep are

- a). non-pregnant (empty) and
- b). have not lambed in the previous 30 days.

EXHIBITORS MAY ONLY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF TWO ANIMALS IN ANY ONE CLASS.

PIGS

19. Pigs to have been registered in a published volume or accepted for entry in a forthcoming volume of the British Pig Association's Herd Book. (It is not sufficient for an animal to be 'eligible for registration'). Animals registered in a Grading Register of a Herd Book are not eligible for entry in Agricultural Show Classes.

Litter Numbers: For January classes a range of litter numbers will be accepted. Pigs brought to the Show must be selected from this range and must be herdbook registered before the start of the show.

The ear number, registered name, Herd Book number and date of birth of each pig, also the name and Herd Book number of sire and dam, must be supplied for printing in the catalogue together with the name of the breeder in cases where the exhibitor is not also the breeder.

At all Shows in 2025 female pigs (all breeds) born before 1st January 2024 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show they have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age a birth notified litter of pigs. The farrowing date must be stated on the entry form.

At all Shows in 2025 female pigs born on or after 1st January and before 1st July in the year before the Show must within 18 months of their date of birth have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age a birth notified litter of pigs.

Boars of two years of age and over (all breeds) are to be certified as having sired at least three live litters within the twelve months preceding the first day of the Show. The pigs comprising such litters are to have been litter notified in the British Pig Association's Herd Book or proof of their birth must have been given to the Association.

Boars aged twelve months or more at the time of the exhibition, must have their tusks cut prior to the Show.

All boars must be shown by two competent adult handlers who are equipped with protective boards

The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited (white woodflour is permitted).

EXHIBITORS MAY ONLY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF THREE ANIMALS IN ANY ONE CLASS.

The Association will provide pens and straw for all exhibits. The provision of feeding stuffs, drinking utensils etc., will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.

General

Fodder

20. Straw and, if possible, green food will be served out in suitable quantities to the Stockpersons of Exhibitors of Animals free of expense. In view of the possible scarcity of green fodder exhibitors are advised to bring as much green fodder as possible.

Herd / Flock Advertising

21. Exhibitors are permitted to erect signs advertising their herd or flock. For the cattle these must not exceed the height of the headboard rail and also not interfere with the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association Headboards. In the case of flock signs no sign may be erected to stand higher than 61 cm (2') above the pen hurdle height. Separate regulations apply for breed society promotion pens within the sheep section.

The Association reserves the right to remove any sign, should it be deemed to be inappropriate.

Livestock Exhibitor Cubicles

22. A maximum of one livestock exhibitor cubicle can be booked per Exhibitor unless after the closing date of entries spares exist. Cubicles are limited and only available on a first come, first served basis.

Dogs

23. Well behaved dogs are allowed but must be kept on a non-retractable lead at all times.

Interpretation of Regulations

The Association and Council reserves to itself the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed Regulations, Conditions or Prize Lists, and arbitrarily to settle and determine all or any matters, questions or differences, in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also to substitute Judges for those announced in the prize lists, or make additional appointments as may be deemed necessary.

All Exhibitors and other persons admitted to the Show Yard shall be subject to the Rules, Orders, Conditions and Regulations of the Council of the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association.

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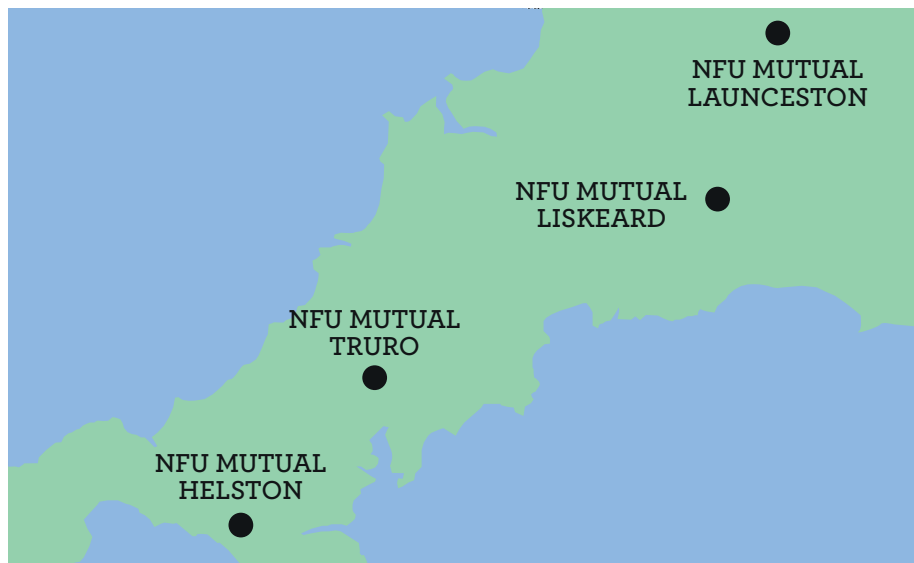
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
