All competitors must bring their horse passports to the Secretary's tent for inspection when collecting their show numbers – no exceptions please.

Passports will be checked at the Secretary's tent upon arrival.

It is important to bring all your own tack, buckets etc to avoid sharing with other horses. Nose-to-nose contact with other horses should be avoided and prevent your horse from grazing at the show.

If your horse is showing any signs of ill-health, do not bring them to the show please.

- Entries must be in the hands of the Equestrian Secretary by MONDAY 22nd JUNE 2026; late entries will not be accepted.
- Online entries available at www.skeltonshow.com • Entry Fees £15 including VAT UNLESS STATED NEXT TO CLASS
- Please ensure cheques are made payable to 'Skelton Show'.
- No entries will be accepted unless on the correct 'Horse Classes Only' official entry form and all fees must be paid at time of entry.
- All exhibitor numbers will be available at the Equestrian Secretary's tent on show day, please ensure the correct number is being worn for the correct class.
- Show and vehicle passes are not required.
- Only trailers and wagons will be allowed on the show field, cars will be required to park in the allocated car parks, please ensure all of your equipment is with you.
- Please check your relevant section for judging commencement times.
- Competitors who are eligible for the Grand Parade please check your classes and be at main ring for 1.30pm to Parade at 2.30pm.
- Trophies will be available from the Equestrian Secretary's Tent. Please bring your completed cup card with you.
- If your trophy is to be presented in the Grand Parade you will receive a cup card advising you as such.
- Grand Parade Trophy Winners – Please hand in your completed cup card and ensure you have someone with you to collect your trophy at the time of presentation if you are unable to carry it yourself.
- Perpetual Cup Winners are responsible for the safe keeping and return of the Cups to the Society not later than the following show day.
- Horse exhibitors are requested not to exhibit any animal with 'The Cough'. The Hon. Vet has authority to request the exhibitor of any animal reported coughing on the field to withdraw immediately.
- Handlers of a Lead Rein pony in any section must be 16 years of age and over as of 1st January in the current year.
- All ridden horses and ponies to be 4 years old and over.
- Rosettes to 6th place.
- Please also see the shows Rules and Regulations at the front the Schedule/Catalogue.
- Flu Vaccinations – Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccine and then 2nd vaccination 21-92 days later) followed by the first booster (150-215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of arriving at the show. PLEASE NOTE HORSES MUST HAVE BEEN VACCINATED WITHIN 12 MONTHS BEFORE THE SHOW BUT NOT LESS THAN 7 DAYS OF ARRIVING AT THE SHOW.

Horse & Country Racing (HCR) – The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

Qualifying shows are open to members and non-members.

In order to qualify for the HCR Championship Show at Netherton Equestrian, Perth on 5th / 6th September 2026:

- HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)

Competitors then placed 1st or 2nd at a Regional Final gain qualification to the VHS Supreme Final to be held at Arena UK, Lincolnshire on 4th - 6th November 2026. Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Those wishing to join or renew the Society will need to apply for this before 1st April each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged. See VHS website for schedule. VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge. Regional Finals are open to members only. All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, 4th - 6th November 2026. No qualification or membership necessary. This show is affiliated to SPSBS, for Shetland pony classes. Please note the following information.

Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.

Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

To enter a stallion in ANY class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPS-BS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand

colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a colt or stallion bridle badge, these are available to purchase from the SPS-BS.

There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Young Handlers must be a minimum of 3 years of age on the day of the show. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or Stallions in In-hand classes.

Children aged under 12 years old on the day of their class may not show a stallion in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. For Health & Safety purposes judges and exhibitors must remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED. Hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.
