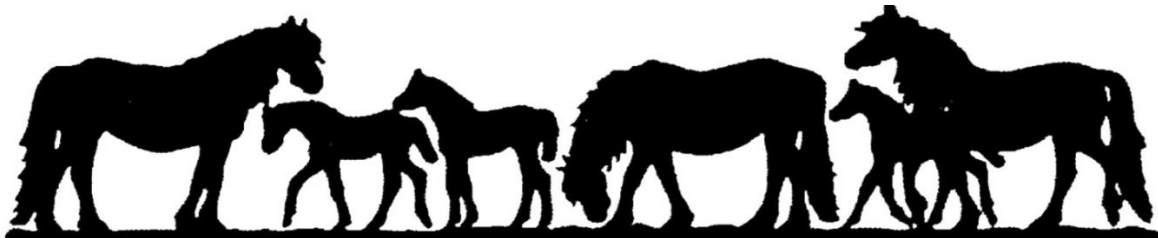

Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn

CLASS 37: MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND SMALL BREEDS RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and Welsh B. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year and suitably mounted. Spurs must not be worn.

CLASS 38: LEAD REIN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein to be attached to the noseband only

CLASS 39: FIRST RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

CLASS 40: LEAD REIN PLAITED RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Lead Rein Pony mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

CLASS 41: FIRST RIDDEN PLAITED RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

CLASS 42: COLOURED HORSE/PONY RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Ponies: Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn. Ponies under 153 cms.

Horses: Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Animals 153cms and over.

CLASS 43: PLAITED PONY RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Open to horses and ponies of any breed, type and height, 15 years and over. Riders of any age, suitably mounted – animals will not be galloped. Spurs not to be worn. Blemishes are not taken into consideration.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Or for British Riding Pony Classes must be registered in the appropriate section of the British Riding Pony Studbook. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 4th – 6th August 2026. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided

the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

RULES

1. All ponies in Novice classes must be shown in a snaffle bridle
2. The Committee reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate any Class(es) or sub-divide if necessary.
3. The Committee reserve the right to refuse entries without giving a reason
4. Any objections must be handed to the secretary in writing within 10 minutes of the class being judged, accompanied by £20.00. Deposit returnable if the objection is upheld.
5. The Committee will not be responsible for any accident to animals, persons or property.
6. The decisions of the Judges and Committee are final.
7. No entry fees will be refunded without a veterinary certificate
8. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to enter their ponies in the correct class or classes.
9. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by full fees.
10. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards MUST be worn by all Riders when mounted. All PAS 015; VG1; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. The EN1384, BSEN1384 may also be worn until 1st January 2017, unless otherwise notified. Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured skull caps/riding hat that meets one of the above standards.
11. No loose dogs allowed on the showground.
12. Show canes/whips must not exceed 30".
13. Registration numbers (if applicable) must be stated on the entry form and with entries on the day.
14. All Stallions and colts, two years old or over, must be in possession of a current Ministry of Agriculture, National Pony Society or appropriate Breed Society Stallion Licence, except Highland and Dales ponies where this rule is extended to three years old or over.
15. All ponies entered in M&M classes must be registered in their respective Stud Books and shown under their Breed Society Showing Rules. **Ridden Stallions MUST display a stallion bridle disc. In Hand stallions and colts 2 years old or over must be adequately bitted and may display a stallion bridle marker.**
16. Handlers of stallions or colts must have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January of the current year. In Mountain and Moorland classes, riders of stallions must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January of the current year when riding small breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B). For large breeds (Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Welsh C & D) riders must have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January.

From J23 M5/Bridgwater A39

- A39 Follow signs to Street/Glastonbury.
- Go through Ashcott village until you reach the junction heading to the A361/Taunton.
- Turn right onto the A361 Taunton Road, travel through the villages of Pedwell and Greinton.
- Pass the Greylake Inn (now a private house) on your right hand side and the motor garage on your left.
- Look for KSEC signs.
- Turn left into the entrance approx. 200m after the garage.
- Keep left and go down the track.

From Podimore roundabout A303

- Take the A372 for approx.. 1 mile.
- Turn right onto the B3151 signposted Street.
- Follow road, pass Somerton and through the village of Compton Dundon.

- Rise up the top of the hill where you come across a crossroads.
- Turn left over Street Hill and drop down through Berhill to the Pipers Inn junction.
- Turn left and immediately left onto the A361 Taunton Road, travel through the villages of Pedwell and Greinton.
