The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey the instructions of the Organisers, Officials and Stewards.

IMPORTANT: Equine Influenza:

In order to attend the 2023 Stithians Show all horses & ponies must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 – 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 – 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show. Foals In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course. We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians. Please note that neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office prior to the event. However, random checks will be carried out on the showground during the show. **Additional information can be found here:**

SHOWING CLASS AFFILIATION RULES

This show is affiliated to the British Show Horse Association (BSHA) DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW

Classes 1-5 qualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 3 to qualify. If second and third are unqualified, they will qualify for the BSHA qualifier (semi-final) at Addington Equestrian Centre on the Sunday 10th September. Qualification for Rising Star Supreme Final or BSHA National Championship Semi-Final will not go beyond third place.

Classes 1-5 are available to amateur members and non-members, please see Rule 7 in 2023 BSHA Rulebook. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at a HOYS Final (not including SFAS, but to include the top three placings in the SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the current season and two years prior to the current season (not including SFAS). Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Final at Hickstead.

Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 7 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down the line. No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes. JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes. The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

Exhibitors wishing to enter **Class 13** who are not registered with The British Show Horse Association can purchase a day ticket – details from www.britishshowhorse.org. Horses registered with the Association must be owned, exhibited and ridden by current BSHA members. **Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.** Day Tickets. Non-members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Working Show Horse Class 15. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form from the BSHA website.

This show is affiliated to the National Pony Society (NPS). Classes 20-32 are qualifiers for the **NPS Summer Championship Show** (1st to 3rd August 2023) to be held at the Three Counties Showground, Malvern. These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part bred are not eligible unless over-stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non- members but only ponies owned by adult NPS **Qualifying or Life** members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from **1st to 3rd August 2023. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.** NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated.

These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

Classes 43, 45 & 46 are qualifiers for the NPS/Tryhall Stud British Riding Pony (Show Pony) In Hand Supreme National Championship & NPS/Team Charlesworth British Riding Pony (Show Hunter Pony) In Hand National Championship. Both the highest placed Show Pony and the highest placed Show Hunter Pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may be passed down to 3rd place if the 1st and 2nd placed ponies have already qualified.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 1st – 3rd August 2023. These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a **Qualifying or Life** member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. NPS M&M Breed & British Riding Pony (SP & SHP) Semi-Final Championship Qualifiers for the Great British In Hand Show – 2nd September 2023, Oakridge Arena, Newark.

This show is affiliated to the British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA)

Classes 34-37 & 47-50 are qualifiers for the BSPA World Championships of Colour National Championship Show to be held at The College EC, Keysoe, Beds, in September 2023.

BSPA classes are open to members and non -members with Skewbald and Piebald horses and ponies only. Only members can qualify for WCC. These classes are affiliated to the British Skewbald and Piebald association and are qualifiers for the World of Colour National Championship Show. All classes will be judged within the rules and criteria of the BSPA. Copies of the rulebook and membership/horse registration/over-stamping forms can be obtained from their show office 01354638226 or downloaded from www.bspaonline.com. All stallions 4 years and over must be graded licensed and registered with BSPA in order to compete, BSPA bridle discs to be worn). To in order to qualify all owners/handlers/riders must be members of the BSPA and all horses/ponies registered with BSPA prior to the show. BSPA qualification cards must be produced in the ring and be signed by the judge, otherwise qualification is invalid. All shows held after 10th August 2023 are qualifiers for WCC 2023 qualification 1-3 in all classes or 1-4 for classes exceeding 12.

This show is affiliated to The Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society and "Best Shetland" rosettes will be awarded in **classes 20, 22, 23 & 24** providing the exhibit is registered with the society.

Exhibits in Classes 40 & 41 must be fully paid-up members of the International Miniature Horse and Pony Society Ltd (IMHPS) Horses registered with IMHPS and placed 1st - 3rd in both classes qualify for the Miniature Horse of the Year Show to be held in October 2023 at Keysoe College, Bedford.

This show is a qualifier for TSR Showing Finals. All In Hand & Ridden classes are qualifiers. You do not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals. The 4 highest placed handlers/riders will qualify in each class. Competitors **MUST** have their qualification flyer signed by judge/steward/secretary. Flyers are available free from the website: www.theshowingregister.co.uk

Any exhibitor wishing to enter a protest must do so in writing to the Secretary, accompanied by a deposit of £20. If the protest is not sustained, the deposit may be forfeited. If the protest is upheld and any award winner becomes disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding award will take the award of the disqualified winner and the lowest award shall go to the reserve award. No protest can be accepted after the conclusion of the Show, nor will any protest be accepted until all the horses in the particular class have left the ring. This does not affect the protest procedures for affiliated classes

BSHA RISING STAR DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW

RISING STAR OF RIDDEN COB TYPE

Classes 1A, 1B & 1C to enter the ring together but **each section to be judged separately.**

CLASS 1A: LIGHTWEIGHT COB

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone; The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

CLASS 1B: HEAVYWEIGHT COB

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone; The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Heavyweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

CLASS 1C: MAXI COB

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. To be shown hogged. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

RISING STAR OF RIDING HORSE TYPE

Classes 2A & 2B to enter the ring together but **each section to be judged separately.**
(Overall winner to receive the Jack & Christine Manhire Perpetual Memorial Trophy)

CLASS 2A: SMALL RIDING HORSE

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Small Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

CLASS 2B: LARGE RIDING HORSE

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Large Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

RISING STAR OF HACK TYPE

CLASS 3: SMALL AND LARGE HACK

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 160cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Hack Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

RISING STAR OF RIDDEN HUNTER TYPE

CLASS 4: SMALL/LIGHTWEIGHT HUNTER

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed exceeding 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.
(The highest placed Small Hunter to receive the perpetual Stroll-On salver)

CLASS 5: MIDDLEWEIGHT/HEAVYWEIGHT HUNTER

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

RISING STAR RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP - Kindly Sponsored by Paddock Apparel

1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 are eligible

Champion Hunter to receive the Pauls & White perpetual trophy

Overall Ridden Champion to receive a Trophy presented by the President

Champion eligible for the Supreme

CLASS 6: OPEN RIDDEN HORSE – COBS, RIDING HORSES, HACKS & HUNTERS

Mares or geldings, 4 years old or over.

This class is **ONLY** for competitors who do not comply with the amateur status required for the Rising Star Classes 1-5. Competitors entering Classes 1-5 cannot enter this class. The winner of this class will go through to the **Supreme Championship**.

OPEN DRIVING *Judge: Mr Brian Ball*

Classes 7A & 7B to enter the ring together but will be judged separately. (*Rosette to be awarded to best Junior Whip*)

CLASS 7A: TRADITIONAL VEHICLES; Singles, Pairs, Tandems or Teams.

CLASS 7B: NON-TRADITIONAL VEHICLES; Singles, Pairs, Tandems or Teams.

CLASS 8: IN HAND HEAVY HORSE OPEN *Judge: Miss Julie Rogers*

All ages; To include registered horses and un-registered horses.

CORNISH COMBINATION *Judge: Miss Joyce Newberry*

The following classes are open to exhibits owned and ridden by residents of Cornwall and conformation will not be judged. No rider may enter more than one class. Dress code: All mounted competitors must wear a hat or skull to the current safety standard; Tweed, Navy or Black jackets acceptable; No ear-rings or studs to be worn; Spurs may be worn in class 12 only.

CLASS 9: LEAD REIN - *Kindly Sponsored by High Park Plant & Skip Hire*

Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday by the 1/1/23; Snaffle bridles must be worn with the leading rein attached to the noseband. (*The youngest rider to receive the W.D. Uren Perpetual Trophy*)

CLASS 10: FIRST RIDDEN

Mare or Gelding; 4 years old and over; Riders to have attained their 7th birthday but not their 12th birthday by 1/1/23; No leading reins; Any suitable bridle.

CLASS 11: YOUNG RIDER

Mare or Gelding; 4 years old and over; Riders to have attained their 12th birthday but not their 16th birthday by 1/1/22; Any suitable bridle. (*The winner to receive the Somar International Perpetual Shield*)

BEST RIDER CHAMPIONSHIP

Two riders each from classes 9-11 will be nominated to come forward for the Championship.

CLASS 12: OPEN

Stallion, Mare or Gelding; 4 years old and over; Riders 16 years or over, Any suitable bridle. (*The winner to receive the Somar International Perpetual Shield*)

COMBINATION CHAMPIONSHIP - Kindly Sponsored by Animal Health Retail

1st & 2nd prizewinners from classes 9-12 are eligible

Champion eligible for the Supreme

WORKING HORSE CLASSES *Judges: Conf: Mr Jonathan Geake - Ride: Mrs Clare Poole*

CLASS 13: BSHA WORKING SHOW HORSE

Open to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses; Mare or Gelding; 4 years old and over; Exceeding 148cms; Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Any Horse which is a Grade B Showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above, as at 1/1/2023 is not eligible to compete. A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase but must then select one Horse to take through to the Ride and Conformation phases (if required). No change of Rider is allowed. This class is a qualifier for The SEIB Working Show Horse of the Year Final to be held at the BSHA National Championship Show. The two highest placed horses in the top five, not already qualified, will qualify for the Final; no horse placed lower than fifth will qualify.

CLASS 14: OPEN WORKING HUNTER EXCEEDING 153CM

Open to plaited or native types; Stallion, Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Exceeding 153cms; Fences not to exceed 1.00m.

CLASS 15: 153cms OPEN W.H.P.

Open to plaited or native ponies; Stallion, Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Not exceeding 153cms. Fences not to exceed 90cms.

CLASS 16: 143cms OPEN W.H.P.

Open to plaited or native ponies; Stallion, Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Not exceeding 143cms. Fences not to exceed 80cms.

CLASS 17: 133cms OPEN W.H.P.

Open to plaited or native ponies; Stallion, Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Not exceeding 133cms. Fences not to exceed 70cms.

CLASS 18: 122cms OPEN W.H.P.

Open to plaited or native ponies; Stallion, Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Not exceeding 122cms. Fences not to exceed 60cms.

CLASS 19: TINY TOTS OPEN W.H.P.

Open to plaited or native ponies; Mare or Gelding; 4 years old & over; Not exceeding 122cms. Fences not to exceed 50cm. May be lead or assisted.

Health & Safety Policy

Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974

The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999

GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

We commit to operating the Association in accordance with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and all applicable legislation made under the Act 'So far as is reasonably practicable'. Our policy is to ensure that the Show is operated in a safe manner for all our employees, volunteers and the general public, and to provide such information, training and supervision as is needed for this purpose.

We also accept our responsibility for the health and safety of other people who may be affected by our activities. The Association acknowledges that the Show is likely to attract those who may be vulnerable and will consider them in their risk assessment of the event

The Board of Trustees acknowledge that Health and Safety responsibilities within the Association are of equal importance as other priorities and will ensure resources are available to manage Health and Safety. Although the Board of Trustees accept responsibility for the implementation of the policy, it relies on individual employees/volunteers to accept their own duty and responsibility to themselves, fellow workers and others who might be injured/affected by their acts or omissions. The Board of Trustees have nominated the Chairman and a representative from the Showyard Directors as signatories of the Health and Safety Policy.

A signed copy of the full Health and Safety Policy Statement and a copy of the Show's organisational chart is available from the Show Office.

The policy will be kept up to date, and appropriate to the Association's activities. To ensure this, the policy will be monitored and reviewed every year or more frequently if required.

SAFETY INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

All Exhibitors must comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and all relevant legislation and guidance. Animal exhibitors must also comply with the Animal Welfare Act 2018 and any relevant codes of practice, guidance, etc. provided by the relevant governing body organizations. Further safety information is contained within the Stithians Show Health and Safety Manual which is made available to those exhibiting at the Show.

SHOW SECURITY

The Association's appointed security contractor will provide 24-hour security camera cover from 17:00 on the Monday before the Show until the Tuesday after the Show with additional security guard cover from 09:00 on the Saturday before Show until 09:00 on the Tuesday after the Show. The Association will not be responsible for the safe custody of any article brought for exhibition, nor will they be liable for any loss or damage that may occur to any article. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure they have adequately insured their stock and equipment whilst on site and to report any suspicious behaviour to the Security Team.

FIRE SAFETY

All catering outlets or trade stands must assess the risk of fire. Where an ignition source is identified, or where hot works or cooking is carried out on the stand then suitable firefighting and prevention measures must be put in place. BBQs are not permitted on the Showground.

FIRST AID/MEDICAL

If you are setting up prior to the Sunday of the Show or packing up after the Monday you are advised to ensure you have a first aid kit available. On Show day the Association's First Aid contractor will be on site.

The nearest A & E Dept is at The Royal Cornwall Hospital, Treliske, Truro TR1 3LQ. Minor Injury Units are located at Camborne Redruth Community Hospital, Barncoose, Redruth, TR15 3ER and Falmouth Hospital, Trescobas Road, Falmouth, TR11 2JA; both of which require you to contact NHS 111 by phone or online prior to visiting. All accidents/incidents and near misses must be reported to the Show's Health and Safety Advisor who is contactable by radio or via the Show Office.

GAS SAFETY

Any fixed installation gas equipment (cookers, pipework, valves etc.) must comply with the provisions of the Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations 1998. All catering vans / marquees with gas installation MUST have a Gas Safety Certificate issued by a competent Gas Safe Engineer and dated within the last 12 months. A copy of the certificate MUST BE provided to the organisers prior to entry to the event. Crimped connection fittings must be used rather than jubilee clips. Further information can be found on the Nationwide Caterers Association website The Gas Safety Checklist - The Do's and Don'ts - NCASS

Electrical Supply

Legislation requires electrical equipment to be maintained in good condition and for it to be suitable for the environment in which it is to be used. All portable electrical equipment brought onto the showground must be maintained in good condition and where required evidence of portable appliance testing be available to our Officers. The Show reserves the right to remove from use any equipment that they deem to be unsafe. Further information is available from the HSE website <https://www.hse.gov.uk/pubns/books/hsg107.htm>

Diesel and LPG generators - the use of diesel and LPG generators is permitted provided modern, quiet equipment is used. Stand-alone petrol generators are not permitted. Petrol generators that are professionally built in as part of an operating unit may be used. The Association reserves the right to request any generator that is unsafe or causing a nuisance from fumes be switched off and removed.

SHOWGROUND TRAFFIC

All Showground traffic must give priority to pedestrians and riders and strictly observe speed restrictions at times when such movement is permitted. The speed limit on site is **10mph**.

During the Show (09:00 to 18:00) all Showground roadways must be kept clear of any obstruction to allow unimpeded access by emergency vehicles. **There is no unauthorised vehicle movement permitted between the hours of 09:00 and 18:00.**

Livestock exhibitors: may leave the Showground prior to 18:00 hours, subject to the approval of a Showyard Director and notification to the Section Secretary (movement is to enable compliance with Animal Welfare Regulations). The Livestock dispersal will be strictly controlled.

WASTE

Traders and Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring that any waste is removed from site and their area is left in a clean and tidy state.

OPENING HOURS

Trade and Craft Stand Exhibitors are required to remain open until 18:00 and MUST NOT attempt to leave the Showground before that time. Those found to be packing up early and attempting to leave the Showground may find that their application is refused for future shows.

MAJOR INCIDENT PLANNING (SITE EVACUATION)

In the event of a major incident where it is necessary to evacuate the site or part of the site, please follow all signs and instructions from the organisers and Emergency Services. ALL people will be requested to evacuate the site, until it is deemed safe to return. The Association accepts no responsibility for any property or livestock or any person or persons who fail to comply with the request to evacuate the Showground. **(Animal Escape)** Animals are unpredictable and do occasionally break free. Please get yourself and others under your control to safety in a quiet and calm manner and allow those involved in the recapture to do this unimpeded.

PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

Whilst the Association has its public liability cover in place it is only for its own protection. All exhibitors must have their own public liability insurance which covers them for attendance at the Stithians Show.
