### GENERAL NOTES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- No person to show more than two lots in any class.
- No person judging shall be allowed to exhibit.
- Local classes confined to exhibitors in the Parishes of: *St Breock, St Issey, Little Petherick, St Merryn, St Ervan, St Eval, Padstow, St Wenn, Withiel, Egloshayle, St Mabyn, St Kew, St Endellion, St Minver, St Tudy, St Teath, Michaelstow, Lanivet, Cardinham, Blisland, Lanhydrock, Bodmin, St Columb and St Mawgan.*
- The Committee reserve the right to make any alteration they may deem necessary.
- Livestock and Produce Section prize money must be collected in the Exhibition Hall on the Show Day.
- The Committee shall not be responsible for any accidents, loss or damage which might occur.
- Points Value - 1st = 4, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 3, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 2, 4<sup>th</sup> = 1

### LIVESTOCK SECTION

- **TB Regulations:** Exhibitors are required to comply with current TB regulations. For those cattle coming from six monthly or annual testing parishes please note it is a requirement that the animals at the show are tested within 60 days before this show. Compliance with pre-movement testing requirements is the responsibility of the owner/cattle keeper moving the animal(s). Full details can be found on the DEFRA website as follows: <http://www.defra.gov.uk/animal-diseases/files/tb-infonote-1202-pre-movement.pdf>
- **Maedi-Visna:** A completed SAC Sheep Health Scheme Certificate (which has not expired), will be collected along with the ARAMS 1 Movement Form upon arrival at the show.
- **Electrical safety:** The correct maintenance and safe use of any electrical equipment brought to the show is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor, both for their own safety and of any third party. It is highly recommended that electrical equipment is regularly PAT tested.
- **Arrival & Departure Times:** All cattle and sheep must be at the Exhibition Hall by 9.30am. Judging will commence at 10.00am with the Championship being judged at approximately 2.15pm. Cattle and Sheep should not be removed until 4.00pm. Sheep to be haltered and tied.
- It would be appreciated if exhibitors could provide their own straw where necessary.
- Cattle and sheep must have been in the ownership and possession of the exhibitor before the 1st day of October of the current year. All cattle must be entered in the correct class as per their Cattle Passport details.
- We recommend that all exhibitors ensure that they have adequate Public Liability Insurance cover.
- All protests in the Livestock Section must be made in writing within half an hour of the class being judged, and a fee of £2.00 to be paid. If the protest is upheld, the fee will be returned. The Committee's decision to be final.
- Animals entered in a Local class can also be entered in an Open class.
- Only 2 entries per exhibitor are permitted in each class.
- An animal can only be entered once in classes 2-10 within the cattle section.
- Lambs to be only entered in one class however, lambs entered in a Local class can also be entered in an Open class.
- **Entry Fees:** **Local classes** have an entry fee of **£1 per entry**, all **Open classes** have an entry fee of **£2 per entry**, there is no entry fee for the beef and sheep Young Handler classes.



## ROYAL CORNWALL AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION - CORNISH POINTS CHAMPIONSHIP

This show is one of four (**Liskeard**, Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> October, **Helston**, Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> November, **Wadebridge**, Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> November and **Truro**, Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> December) at which points will be offered towards Prizes of 1<sup>st</sup>, £75 and 2<sup>nd</sup>, £25 in both the Open cattle and sheep classes for the exhibitors gaining the most points over the 2023 Cornish winter show season.

Points will be awarded as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> prize, 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize, 2 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> prize, 1 point and exhibits must be entered under the same names at the relevant shows, to be eligible.

### PRODUCE SECTION

- **Arrival Times:** All produce etc to be staged before 9.30am on the Saturday and cannot be removed until 4.15pm. Exhibition Hall open 6pm - 7.30pm on Friday for staging of produce (except dead poultry, butter, cream, eggs, milk and cookery which should not be staged until the morning of the Show). The Produce Exhibition will be open from 12noon - 4pm and exhibitors are requested to be in attendance at 4.15pm to remove their exhibits.
- All protests in the Produce Section (Classes 38 - 171) to be made in writing and no protest will be accepted after 3.30pm. Fee of 50p must be paid. If protest is upheld, fee will be refunded.
- All roots to be shown with roots and tops complete and must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- All poultry to be hatched in 2023.
- Judges have the power to test butter, cream, eggs, cookery etc.
- All garments and other handicraft items must not have been used prior to being exhibited at the Show or shown at this show previously and must have been completed within the last 12 months.
- **Entry Fees:** All individual entry fees are **20p per entry**, with the exception of the children classes (162 - 172) whereby there is no charge/these do not have an entry fee, and the carcass classes, please see carcass class notes.
- Please note that all WI entries are to be sent to County House - CFWI Chy Noweth an Conteh, Truro Business Park, Threemilestone, Truro TR4 9NH.
- Presentation of Challenge Cups at 4.00pm by the President.

## YFC Judging Notes:

- Open to YFC Members who must be 28 years of age or under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023. Ed Harris will be taking entries on the day if not entered before.
- Competitors must provide themselves with white coats, which must be worn during the period of the competition.

## Procedure for Beef & Sheep Live Judging

- Place a group of 4 cattle/sheep in order of merit and give reasons for those placings. The animals will be designated A, B, X, Y.
- 10 minutes judging - handling allowed. At least 5 minutes - preparing cards for handing to stewards.
- Competitors may handle the live cattle/sheep but only in such a way that they do not cause bruising. Excessive handling after a caution from the stewards will result in disqualification.
- Up to 2 minutes will be allowed for each competitor to give his or her reason to the Judge. Competitors should be comparative rather than descriptive when stating their reasons. 2 marks will be deducted for each 15 seconds (or part thereof) that a competitor goes over the allotted 2 minutes. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.
- Scale of Marks: Placings: 100, Reasons: Accuracy of observations: 25, Comparison: 15, Style (including presentation of competitor): 10. **TOTAL: 150 per class**

## Procedure for Lamb Carcase Judging

- Competitors will have 10 minutes judging time to view the lamb carcasses.
- Competitors will be required to place the four lamb carcasses and grade them in accordance with the MLC Classification system.
- Up to two minutes will be allowed for each competitor to give their reasons to the judge. Two marks will be deducted for each fifteen seconds that a competitor goes over the allotted two minutes.
- Scale of Marks: Placing: 50, Correct MLC Classification: 50, Reasons (Accuracy): 25, Comparison: 15, Style (inc. Presentation): 10. **Total: 150**

Please ensure all movement paperwork reads as R.J. Trevarthen Ltd as the destination.
- No exhibitor to enter more than two lambs or two pigs.
- Pigs and Sheep to be born in year of show.
- R.J. Trevarthen Ltd have been appointed to stage the carcass section, with the slaughtering charges including MLC levies as follows; **£30 per pig & £22 per sheep**. For any entries which are withdrawn prior to the Show, these slaughtering charges will be refunded.
- The Association reserve the right to cancel the carcass section should insufficient entries be received.
- All carcasses entered must be removed from the Show by the exhibitor at approximately 4.15pm.
- The Association will arrange for butchers to be present to cut carcasses if required.

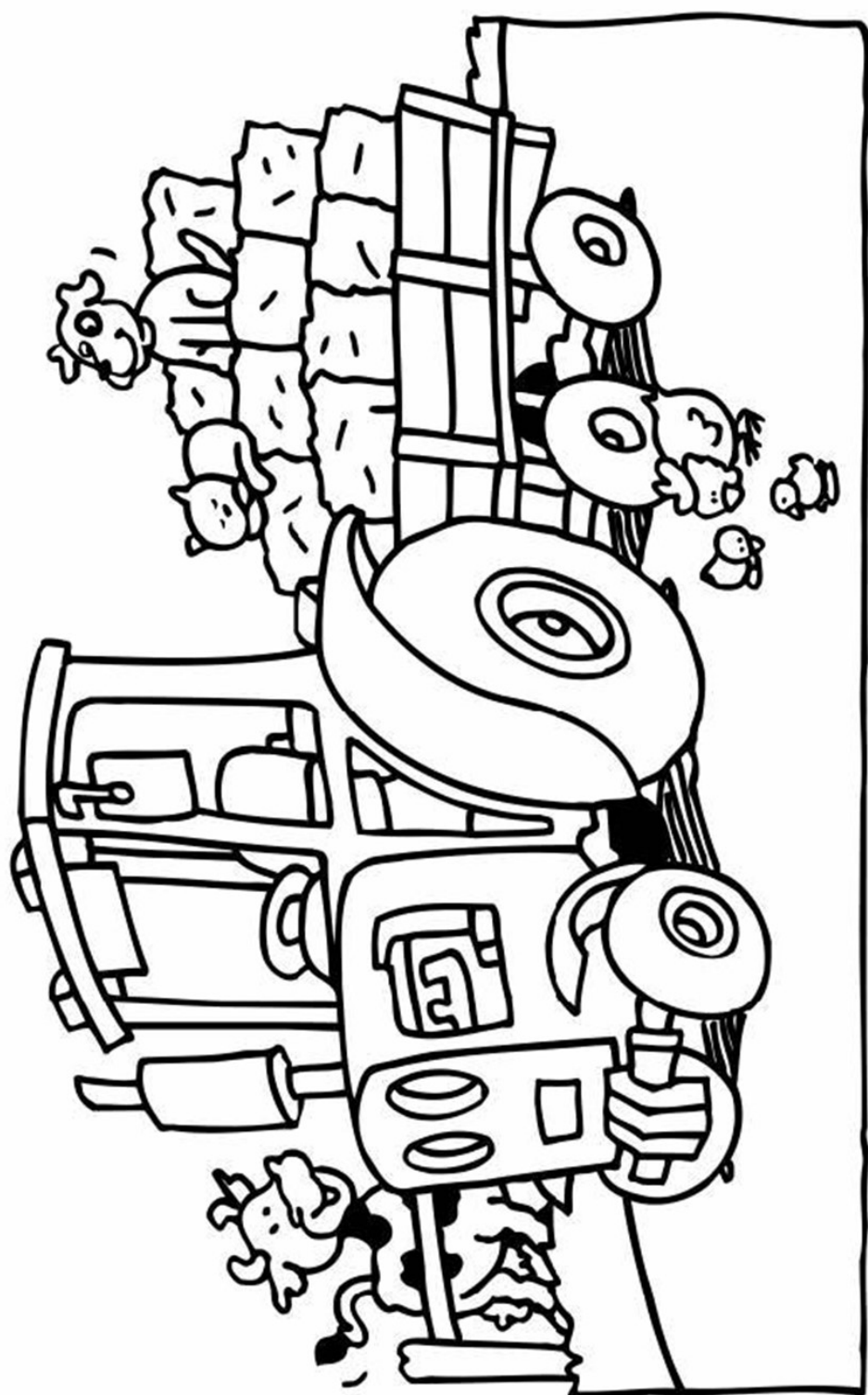
