Pig Entries will be accepted on the following basis:

- Advanced Entries close on Monday 27th April 2026. Any entries after this date to carry a premium of £1 per entry to **Final Closing Date Monday 18th May 2026**. Entries in all sections will be subject to limitations on availability of pens
- Payment will be per pen (Space approx. 8' x 6' in covered accommodation) A maximum of 2 pigs are allowed per pen. One free kit pen will be allocated per exhibitor
- Entries are required to arrive on the Showground not later than 6pm on Tuesday 16th June, and must remain until 5pm on Thursday 18th June
- Before entering, please read the Special Conditions below and class description
- All pigs must be identified in accordance with current legal requirements and accompanied by correct movement documentation
- In the event of low exhibitor numbers in any of the breed classes or low entries catalogued, classes may be cancelled or amalgamated

### **Conditions**

The British Pig Association offers prizes to Agricultural Show Societies subject to their accepting the following Conditions:

- 1 Separate classes (at least three) to be provided for each breed to which the prizes relate
- 2 Classes to be open to competitors residing in any part of the United Kingdom
- 3 BPA rosettes will be awarded only to members of the British Pig Association
- 4 Judges to be selected from British Pig Association official lists and may be accompanied by a BPA appointed apprentice judge
- 5 Identifying information for each exhibit to appear in catalogues in the following order:  
(Primary ID = HDL/Ear No.) - in brackets; registered name; Herd Book number; date born; names and Herd Book numbers of sire and dam; together with the name of the breeder, if different from that of the exhibitor  
Please note that all the above information can be found in the BPA on-line herdbook in the pedigree pigs section of our website at [www.britishpigs.org](http://www.britishpigs.org). Exhibitors should supply the registration number of each pig on their entry form. This number can then be used to display all the information required for the catalogue. Show societies are requested to use this facility to verify that the information supplied on the entry form is correct before printing the catalogue
- 6 The BPA Special Conditions published to Societies, defining breeding requirement etc. for certain ages of pig, to appear in Show Schedules. Only those Special Conditions concerning breeds for which relevant classes are provided need be printed  
If any Special Condition is already incorporated in a Society's own Regulations, repetition is unnecessary

- 7 The catalogue to include in the pig section a statement that classes are held under BPA Special Conditions as printed in the Show Schedule
- 8 A catalogue detailing all awards and Championship winners in the appropriate class(es) of the pig section or a full print out of all pig results to be sent to the BPA within fourteen days after the Show

### **SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR ALL PIG EXHIBITORS**

1. Pigs to have been registered in a published volume or accepted for entry in a forthcoming volume of the British Pig Association's Herd Book. (It is not sufficient for an animal to be "eligible for registration")  
Animals registered in a Grading Register of a Herd Book are not eligible for entry in Agricultural Show Classes  
The ear number, registered name, Herd Book number and date of birth of each pig must be supplied for printing in the catalogue together with the name of the breeder in cases where the exhibitor is not also the breeder
2. At all Shows in 2025, female pigs (all breeds) born before 1st January 2022 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show they have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age, a birth notified litter of pigs
3. At All Shows in 2025 female pigs born on or after 1st January and before 1st July in the year before the show must within 18 months of their date of birth have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age a birth notified litter of pigs
4. Boars of two years of age and over (all breeds) are to be certified as having sired at least three live litters within the twelve months preceding the first day of the Show. The pigs comprising such litters are to have been litter notified in the British Pig Association's Herd Book or proof of their birth must have been given to the Association
5. Boars aged twelve months or more at the time of exhibition, must have their tusks cut prior to the Show
6. All boars must be shown by two competent handlers who are equipped with protective boards.
7. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited (white wood flour is permitted)

The Lincolnshire Show is a qualifying round for the Berkshire Pig Breeders' Clubs Champion of Champions 2026 (the Jo Clarke Memorial Trophy to the Winner and the Welwick Salver to the Runner-up, plus cash prizes) which will take place later in

the year – venue tbc. If the Champion has already qualified, the Reserve Champion will go forward.

No pig may qualify more than once. In the event of the Reserve Champion having previously qualified the judge will be asked to nominate another pig to go forward to the final.

**Best British Saddleback Pig:** The Lincolnshire Show is a qualifier event for the British Saddlebacks Champion of Champions. (The Breed Champion will be deemed to be the qualifier and will receive a Qualifier rosette from the BSBC and shall be eligible to compete at the finals at Malvern Autumn Show.)

**Best Junior British Saddleback:** Pig The highest placed Saddleback pigs born in the year of the show of each sex will be eligible to enter for the final of the Junior British Saddleback Championship at Malvern Autumn Show. If for any reason the Judge's selection is unable to attend the Final, the reserve may go instead.

**Best Middle White Pig:** The Middle White Pig Breeders' Club presents rosettes for the Champion and Reserve Champion Middle White. Club members will qualify for the Middle White Champion of Champions at The Great Yorkshire Show.

**Best Gloucestershire Old Spot Pig:** The Lincolnshire Show is a qualifier event for the Gloucestershire Old Spots Pig Breeders' Club Annual Northern Championship, venue to be confirmed.

- The Best pig will receive 'Qualifier' Rosette and the Runner- up will receive a 'Reserve Qualifier' for this event
- If the Champion has already qualified at a previous event then the Runner-up may compete at the Great Yorkshire Show

**Best Tamworth Pig:** The Tamworth Breeders' Club offers a rosette for the Champion Tamworth of the Show. The winner will qualify for the Tamworth Champion of Champions at the Dorset County Show

### **B.P.A PIG OF THE YEAR COMPETITION**

#### **Conditions**

1. Qualifying rounds will be arranged at Agricultural Shows, leading to a Final.
2. A condition of entering the competition is that prize winners at preliminary rounds must intend to exhibit at the Final.
3. The award is open to all breeds of pedigree pigs entered in this Show. The object is to determine the best modern and traditional breed pigs as an example of their respective breeds.
4. All animals entered in this Competition must be the property of a member of the British Pig Association or the British Lop Society and must be registered in a Herdbook of the British Pig Association or The British Lop Pig Society.
5. To be eligible for a qualifying round a pig (male or female) must be born on or after July 1 of the year before the Show (see 7 below).  
A pig judged Best Male (Modern or Traditional) or Best Female (Modern or Traditional) in a qualifying round cannot compete in any subsequent round. If a pig having qualified at an earlier show again qualifies at a later show the judge for that breed shall select an alternative pig of the same breed and sex from any class covering the required age group.
6. Where a single breed has more than one class covering the required age group for either sex, so permitting more than one 1st prize animal, the judge must nominate one of these for the qualifying round.
7. Where there are multi-breed classes, i.e. any other modern/any other traditional breed or a similar classification, the judge must nominate the best male and best female of the qualifying age of each breed represented (regardless of class prizes). These pigs will compete in the qualifying round with eligible entries from individual breed classes.
8. At each qualifying round the judge will select the Best Male from a Modern Breed, Best Male from a Traditional Breed, Best Female from a Modern Breed, Best Female from a Traditional Breed, Best Pig and Reserve Best Pig.

9. The Best Males (Modern and Traditional) and Best Females (Modern and Traditional) from each of the qualifying rounds will qualify for the Final to be held at the Great Yorkshire Show.
10. The Final will be to judge the Best Modern Male and Female with Reserves and the Best Traditional Male and Female with Reserves; the Best Pig (i.e. Pig of the Year) and Reserve.
11. In the Final at the Great Yorkshire Show, the Modern and Traditional Male and Female Champions will each receive £60, Reserve Champions £30. Overall Champion £200 and The Geoffrey Cloke Memorial Salver, and Reserve £150

## **B.P.A. YOUNG PIG OF THE YEAR COMPETITION**

### **Conditions**

1. Qualifying rounds will be arranged at Agricultural Shows, leading to a Final
2. A condition of entering the competition is that prize winners at preliminary rounds must intend to exhibit at the Final.
3. The award is open to all breeds of pedigree pigs entered in this show. The object is to determine the best young pig born in the year of the show as an example of their respective breeds.
4. All animals entered in this Competition must be the property of a member of the British Pig Association and must be registered in BPA's herd books or the British Lop Pig Society's Herd Book.
5. To be eligible for a qualifying round a pig (male or female) must be born on or after January 1 of the year of the Show (see 7 below).  
A pig judged Best Young Male or Best Young Female in a qualifying round cannot compete in any subsequent round. If a pig having qualified at an earlier show again qualifies at a later show the judge for that breed shall select an alternative pig of the same breed and sex from any class covering the required age group.
6. Where a single breed has more than one class covering the required age group for either sex, so permitting more than one 1st prize animal, the judge must nominate one of these for the qualifying round.
7. Where there are multi-breed classes, i.e. any other modern/any other traditional breed or a similar classification, the judge must nominate the best male and best female of the qualifying age of each breed represented (regardless of class prizes). These pigs will compete in the qualifying round with eligible entries from individual breed classes.
8. At each qualifying round the judge will select the Best Young Male and Best Young Female.
9. The Best Young Male and Best Young Female from each of the qualifying rounds will enter the Final. The prizes for preliminary rounds will be a glass trophy for the best young pig of each sex. Note: Rosettes only will be presented at each preliminary round. Glass trophies for preliminary rounds will be presented at the Final.
10. The Final will be to judge the Best Modern Male and Female with Reserves and the Best Traditional Male and Female with Reserves; the Best Pig (ie Young Pig of the Year) and Reserve.
11. In the Final at the Royal Three Counties Showground, Malvern Autumn Show, the Modern and Traditional Male and Female Champions will each receive £60, Reserve Champions £30, overall Champion £200 and The Jack Howlett Memorial Trophy, and Reserve £150.
