Advanced Entries close on Thursday 27 April 2023. Any entries after this date to carry a premium of £10 per booking to Final Closing Date, Thursday 4 May 2023.

RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. Please ensure that you are aware of DEFRA/APHA information regarding cattle Movements and Health regulations. It is your responsibility to keep up to date with any change of policies/legislation etc.
- 2. All Livestock Exhibitors should ensure that they have adequate Public Liability Insurance Cover. All exhibitors are responsible for the observance by themselves, their employees, representatives or contractors of all Health & Safety at Work Regulations.
- 3. Smoking is NOT PERMITTED in any of the livestock lines and neighbouring areas.
- 4. Please dispose of any litter in the bins provided, not in the straw.
- 5. Bovine Tuberculosis: Where a herd is subject to 12-monthly TB testing and so must undergo pre-movement TB testing, please bring a copy of the results with you to the Show. Please observe the current DEFRA/APHA regulations regarding pre and post-movement TB Testing. For advice on Bovine TB please visit www.tbhub.co.uk

- 1. LAS Membership must be held in the name of the Exhibitor (i.e. the Owner) to qualify for Livestock Entry Membership Discount.
- 2. Every animal entered MUST be the property of the Exhibitor and its Passport MUST be in the Name of the Exhibitor. Transfer of Ownership Documentation must be completed before the Show.
- 3. Each animal may only be entered for one Cattle Class. However, this animal may then be entered in the relevant section's Pairs/Group Class(es) and Exhibitor bred classes in the case of Dairy Cattle. All entries are of course, eligible for any Special and Championship Classes which may be offered in each section.
- 4. The Advanced Closing date for online entries is Thursday 27 April. The FINAL Closing Date is Thursday 4 May (with additional £10 Booking Fee)

GENERAL 10 points:

- 1. Entries are required to arrive on the Showground by 6pm. on Tuesday, 20 June, and remain until 5pm on Thursday 22 June. (Exception being Commercial Beef entries to arrive by 4pm, Tuesday, 20 June)
- 2. All animals must be accustomed to being tied or haltered and exhibitors will be responsible for presenting them.
- 3. Where an entry is found to be entered in the wrong class it will be transferred automatically.
- 4. The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry or class and will automatically cancel any class in which there are insufficient entries. The Society also reserves the right to restrict entries if numbers exceed those which can be adequately dealt with.
- 5. Exhibitors entering animals in more than one breed section must make the online booking for the number of stalls required for the specific breed and TB status. All animals belonging to one exhibitor will stand in their respective breed lines (with Stewards discretion where needed).
 - All Commercial Cattle must be housed in the Commercial Cattle Lines.
- 6. Where cows are entered with a calf at foot the exhibitor is required to book two standings and include the Calf's date of birth and ear tag details on the entry.
- 7. Due to a limited number of stalls available, please only book a maximum of one kit pen per exhibitor.
- 8. Prizes will be awarded according to the number of entries forward at the time of judging
- 9. All cattle must be paraded in accordance with the instructions of the Honorary Show Director and Stewards in a safe and responsible manner. Any Exhibitor not parading some of their cattle in the Grand Parade will forfeit any prize money. Bulls must be paraded with two handlers in the Grand Parade. All cattle forward in the Grand Parade on Thursday 22 June will receive a £5 Cash Payment.
- 10. Nobody under the age of 16 may be in charge of an animal in the Grand Parade.
