| Eligibility to Enter (Reg 21) | Exhibitors must ensure the entry is registered with the appropriate breed society for the classes being entered and, where necessary, the Owner, Rider and Exhibitor. |
| Payment of Prizes (Regs 35 & 36) | Winning exhibitors will be issued with a prize money voucher which must be redeemed during the show. Vouchers not presented will be forfeited. |
| Objections (Reg 40) | Must be made in writing and submitted to the Society Office no later than 17:00 on the day of the class and accompanied by a deposit of £50. |
| GDPR Condition of Entry | Details of entries made will only be shared with breed societies and/or shows to confirm eligibility and/or qualification. Results will be displayed on the Show's web site. Breed societies will also provide/use some of your information. Please go to the relevant society's web page to view their policy as to how, when and why your details will be used. |
| Equine Flu (Reg 49) | All equines attending the Royal Bath & West Show 2026 must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. |

Classes H156 to H162

If the Champion has already qualified, then the Reserve Champion will go forward. Only the Champion or Reserve Champion will qualify. Prize Money at the final will be: 1st £1,000; 2nd £400; 3rd £100; 4th £50; 5th £25; 6th £25; 7th £25; 8th £25 together with sashes for the Champion and Reserve, and Rosettes to all other prize winners and finalists. This Championship has been kindly sponsored by Alan Marine.

The IDHS (GB) £2000 Challenge

H1-H4 & H7-H9, H110-114, H115, H116, H118, H120 H133 & H134

This show is a qualifier for the IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge jointly sponsored by the IDHS (GB) and Yorkshire Irish Draught & Hunter Show. The highest placed horse/s (not already qualified) from each of the above classes will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ.

A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.

Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team. In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive £100, and the highest placed Irish Draught Part Bred will receive £50.

The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge

Class H131

This show is a qualifier for The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed Irish Draught pure-breds from each age group in Class H127 eligible under the criteria listed on page 61 of this schedule will qualify. If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify for the final which will be held at the 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ.

Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team. In their respective final, there will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi finalists from each class going forward to the Championship where the Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

HC1 The following class is a qualifier for the Supreme In-Hand Championship, NEC, Birmingham, 7th - 11th October 2026.

The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses). The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete, provided it has not already won a qualifying round in 2026.

Hunter Breeding, Hack Breeding, Riding Horse Breeding, Sport Horse Breeding, Irish Draught Breeding, Show Hunter Breeding, Riding Pony Breeding, Coloured Horse and Pony Breeding, Anglo-Arab or Part Bred Arab, Connemara, Dales & Fell, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Highland, New Forest, Shetland (Miniature), Shetland (Standard), Welsh Mountain Pony (Section A), Welsh Pony (Section B), Welsh Pony (Cob Type) (Section C), Welsh Cob (Section D), Miniature horse and Part Bred Welsh.

If the Champion has already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2026 or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion of that section may come forward, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2026 or are ineligible then the section will not be represented in this qualifying round. Foal champions are not eligible.

In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the qualification will not pass down to the Reserve Champion in the 2nd and any subsequent sections.

There will be no direct entry into Supreme In-hand Championship Qualifier, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable).

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M IN HAND SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE

Judges: Miss Lizzie Briant
Judging on: Thursday

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand sections.

To be judged under the rules of the NPS. NPS silver medal rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion Pony is not a Member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion Pony, provided the owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

Sections eligible are:

Connemara, Dales & Fell, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Highland, New Forest, Shetland (Miniature), Shetland (Standard), Welsh Mountain Pony (Section A), Welsh Pony (Section B), Welsh Pony (Cob Type) (Section C), Welsh Cob (Section D).

HC2 NPS/Blackertor & Sharptor Studs M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show August 2026.

RIDDEN COBS & WORKING SHOW HORSE

Judges: Miss Jeanetta La-four - Conformation & Mr Ian Smeeth – Ride
Judging on: Thursday

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association, and all Owners, Exhibitors, Producers and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry.

DAY TICKETS: Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider and Open affiliated classes only, BUT WILL NOT ALLOW entry into RIHS (excluding Working Show Horse) or HOYS qualifying classes (except RIHS Amateur Classes & RIHS Working Show Horse Class). A Show Ticket has the same criteria and covers all days of a Show running for longer than one day. Horses registered on a Day / Show Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day / Show Ticket by applying online on the BSHA website.

Royal International Horse Show

Classes H2, H3, H4 & H6 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show and will attract a £12.00 RIHS levy with each entry. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

Competitors qualifying at this show for the Agria Royal International Horse must submit their entries ONLINE at: <https://www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling/the-agria-royal-international-horse-show/>

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

BSHA CLASSIC OF THE YEAR

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2026.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse, Racehorse to Showhorse & HOYS Hunter classes).

The IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge

This Show is a qualifier and the highest placed horse (not already qualified) in H1-H4 will qualify for the Final of the IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge. See qualifier page for details.

Class H1 EASY CHIP NOVICE COB/MAXI COB, MARE OR GELDING

Four years old or over, exceeding 148cms. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top three in each class will qualify for the Easy Chip Novice Final at the BSHA National Championship Show in September. Horses competing as four- and five-year-olds in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status, irrespective of any wins, placings or prize money accrued, unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class (with the exception of the Search for A Star Finals). Horses competing as a six year old or

over, in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, (with the exception of the Search For A Star Finals) or have won a first prize of £25 or over in any showing class, excluding Working Show Horse Classes, Rising Star classes and finals, Ladies Show Horse or In-Hand classes, that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. Winnings as a four-year-old are exempt. If a horse changes category (ie from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa), it may not revert to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes. Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a 'Day Ticket' in order to compete in Novice classes. Horses competing in Novice classes must be ridden by the Judge, before being asked to "strip" for conformation.

Class H2 LIGHTWEIGHT COB

Four years old or over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone. (RIHS qualifier).

Class H3 HEAVYWEIGHT COB

Four years old or over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone. (RIHS qualifier).

Class H4 MAXI COB

Four years old or over, exceeding 155cms. To be judged as a Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. WINNERS OF THESE CLASSES ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR OPEN COB CHAMPIONSHIPS. (RIHS qualifier).

Class H5 AMATEUR OWNER RIDER COB/MAXI COB, MARE OR GELDING

Four years old or over, exceeding 148cms. Open to Horses owned and ridden by an Amateur, the Rider need not be the Owner of the Horse. Please see Rule 6 a-c in 2026 BSHA Rulebook.

Class H6 RIHS & SEIB OPEN WORKING SHOW HORSE QUALIFYING CLASS, MARE OR GELDING

This class is a qualifier for the Open Working Show Horse Championship at The Agria Royal International Horse Show. All affiliated BSHA Open Working Show Horse classes held prior to 8th June 2026 are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show final and the SEIB Working Show Horse Final. For the SEIB Working Show Horse qualification, the two highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify. RIHS Qualifying classes held after 1st August will carry the qualification forward to 2026, but only the WINNER will receive qualification in these cases.

Open **ONLY** to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms. This class is **NOT** open to Hunters, ie those horses registered and competing as a hunter or working hunter with BSHA, Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain or The Showing Register for the current season.

The Working Show Horse qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier in order to confirm qualification. Any Horse which is a Grade B Showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above, as at the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible to compete in any Working Show.

Horse class. A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase but must then select one Horse to take through to the Ride and Conformation phases (if required). No change of Rider is allowed (RIHS)

DAY TICKETS: Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of two Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Novice, Amateur, Young Rider, Home Produced, Working, In-Hand and Open affiliated classes only BUT WILL NOT ALLOW entry into RIHS qualifying Open classes (except RIHS Amateur Classes & RIHS Working Show Horse Class). A Show Ticket has the same criteria and covers all days of a Show running for longer than one day. Horses registered on a Day / Show Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day / Show Ticket by applying online on the BSHA website.

Royal International Horse Show

Classes H8 & H9 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show and will attract a £12.00 RIHS levy with each entry. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

BSHA CLASSIC OF THE YEAR

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic of the Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2026.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

The IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge

This Show is a qualifier and the highest placed horse (not already qualified) in H7-H9 will qualify for the Final of the IDHS(GB) £2000 Challenge. See qualifier page for details.

Horses competing as a six year old or over, in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, (with the exception of the Search For A Star Finals) or have won a first prize of £25 or over in any showing class, excluding Working Show Horse Classes, Rising Star classes and finals, Ladies Show Horse or In-Hand classes, that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st

January in the current year. Winnings as a four-year-old are exempt. If a horse changes category (ie from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa), it may not revert to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes. Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a 'Day Ticket' in order to compete in Novice classes. Horses competing in Novice classes must be ridden by the Judge, before being asked to "strip" for conformation.

Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

This competition is open to mares, geldings, and CHAPS (UK) graded stallions are permitted, excluding in Section A. Ponies must be four years old or over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of the stud books of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA). Stallions are required to wear stallion discs in order to compete.

All Riders and owners must be Members of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society, The Showing Register or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association.

All Stallions entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All Stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com.

This class will be divided into five sections, the Junior Ridden must run first, if applicable.

- Section A Junior Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Ponies up to and including 148cm & Non-Native Ponies up to and including 153cm.
- Section B Ridden Non-Native Ponies up to and including 153cm.
- Section C Ridden Non-Native Horses exceeding 153cm.
- Section D Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Ponies up to and including 148cm.

Riders in section A must not have attained their 18th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

HACK AND RIDING HORSE BREEDING

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders, In_Hand Handlers & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day/Show Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited, Produced and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on your entry form.

DAY TICKETS: Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider, and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes (except RIHS Amateur Classes & RIHS Working Show Horse Class). To be shown on the Triangle. A diagram of the Sport Horse Triangle can be found in the SHB(GB) 2026 Handbook.

ALL entries in the following classes do not have to be on the Sport Horse Breeding (GB) Basic Identity Record or Stud Book. The leader who enters the ring with the horse must remain throughout the class. - MARES with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)
- Youngstock must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
- Pure bred ID and ID Sport Horse / Part bred, 3 year old colts must be un-inspected
- All 1, 2 & 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by experienced handlers over 18 years of age

All pure-bred Irish Draught Stallions

This show is a qualifier for the Agria Royal International **British Horse Feeds and IDHS (GB) Ridden Championship Series**.

The 2 highest-placed horses (not already qualified) from Classes **H133** and **H134** will qualify for the final to be held at the **Royal International Horse Show Hickstead, in July 2026**. Qualification can be passed to 3rd place if the highest-placed horses have already qualified and if in the opinion of the judges, the exhibit is of sufficient quality. Horses can only qualify once, irrespective of the number of shows entered. These classes are also qualifiers for the IDHS(GB) £2000 challenge.

Eligibility criteria apply. Please refer to the section in the schedule detailing requirements of IDHS(GB).

- Purebred Irish Draught horses must be registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB).

RETRAINING OF RACEHORSES

Judging on: Friday

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Ridden competitors must wear a safety/kit mark hard hat with chinstrap.

Class H135 TATTERSALLS RoR FORMER RACEHORSE CHALLENGE SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, Mare or gelding 4yrs old, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must have current RoR Competition Registered. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, August 22nd 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10. Codes to be redeemed at the RoR office.

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Ridden Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026.

The Judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.** All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. The class to be judged **50% jumping, 20% Style** while jumping and performance and **30% awarded** for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 70cm to 80cm with a maximum spread of 75cm.

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down, 15 points to be deducted for a refusal, 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

PHASE 2

All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series.

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships Aintree, August 22nd, 2026.

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10. Codes to be redeemed at the RoR office.

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won: a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open /Amateur Ridden Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, or any other open class **except** Tattersalls RoR Challenge Show Series, other Working Hunter type classes or RoR In Hand classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not considered.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.

Class H137 TATTERSALLS RoR OPEN RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER 2026

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over by January 1st 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead on June 21st 2026.

All entries **MUST** be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have **RACED in GB**. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly.

All RoR members entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a current safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 22nd, 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th + Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5.

Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open In-Hand Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026.

Open to members and non-members.

All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. This MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.
