- Entries** Online only at [www.bathandwest.com/show-jumping-competition](http://www.bathandwest.com/show-jumping-competition), closing date 14 May at midnight.
- Tickets** E-tickets may be issued.
- Eligibility** Entries in ALL Classes are confined to registered horses and to be ridden by members in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 77.
- Multi Rides** No Rider may ride more than two horses per class unless at the organiser's discretion.
- Class limits** All classes will be limited to the first 30 entries with the exception of the Area Trial which will be limited to 40 entries.
- Prizes** Paid by BACS after the show.
- Stables** Limited numbers of stables are available, and it is recommended stables are booked when making entries. Availability cannot be guaranteed if trying to book stables upon arrival.  
**An empty stable does not mean it is available.**
- Horse Gate** Closed between 10:00pm and 5:00am unless by prior arrangement.

# IMPORTANT POINTS

Here are a few points to note when making entries into the 2026 Royal Bath & West Show.

Exhibitors should be familiar with the full Terms & Conditions which can be found at – [www.bathandwest.com](http://www.bathandwest.com).

Hats (Reg 7(i))	All mounted persons on the showground to wear safety hats which conform to the current regulations.
Arrival (Reg 13)	
Wednesday	12:00noon to 10:00pm
Thursday & Friday	5:00am to 10:00pm
Saturday	from 5:00am
Stables (Reg 14)	Booking is for a 24hr period, from 5:00pm to 5:00pm the following day. Accommodation cannot be guaranteed until 5:00pm.
Correctness of Details (Reg 18)	It is the Exhibitors' or Competitors' responsibility to ensure that all the information provided is correct.
Refunds (Reg 20)	Refunds will only be provided on production of a veterinary certificate. which must be received by the Entries Office no more than 7 days after the last day of Show. Levies included in the entry fee will not be refunded. Stable fees will not be refunded.
Eligibility to Enter (Reg 21)	Exhibitors must ensure the entry is registered with the appropriate breed society for the classes being entered and, where necessary, the Owner, Rider and Exhibitor.
Payment of Prizes (Regs 35 & 36)	Winning exhibitors will receive prize money via BACS payment following the Show.
Objections (Reg 40)	Must be made in writing and submitted to the Society Office no later than 17:00 on the day of the class and accompanied by a deposit of £50.
GDPR Condition of Entry	Details of entries made will only be shared with breed societies and/or shows to confirm eligibility and/or qualification. Results will be displayed on the Show's web site. Breed societies will also provide/use some of your information. Please go to the relevant society's web page to view their policy as to how, when and why your details will be used.
Equine Flu (Reg 49)	All equines attending the Royal Bath & West Show 2026 must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

## Class 1 - approx. 14:55 – Main Ring - National 1.30m Open

Rule 306. Table A4. Speed 400mpm. Start Height 1.30m.

Open to registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate and Junior Members.

Qualifies for: The British Showjumping National Championships.

Qualifying period: 1st July-30th June.

Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify to the final. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round))

### Pre-Entry

Prizes: 1st: £300.00, 2nd: £200.00, 3rd: £150.00, 4th: £100.00, 5th: £50.00, 6th: £50.00, 7th: £50.00, Total: £900.00.

**Entry Fee = £50.00**

## Class 2 - approx. 15:55 – Main Ring - National 1.40m Open

Rule 301. Single Phase. Speed 375mpm. Start Height 1.40m.

For registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

Qualifies for: National 1.40m Championship at the British Showjumping National Championships.

Qualifying period: 1st July- 30th June

Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify to the final. Also any two double clears from any International Trial or Area Trial or classes 1.40m or above in the qualifying period will qualify for the Final. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round))

FEI tack rules apply with exception of Padded batons and Spurs which must comply with National rules 101.9 & 102.9. Standing martingales are permitted in line with rule 102.3.

Prizes: 1st: £500.00, 2nd: £350.00, 3rd: £250.00, 4th: £150.00, 5th: £100.00, 6th: £75.00, 7th: £75.00, Total: £1,500.00.

**Entry Fee = £55.00**

## Friday 29 May 2026

### Class 3 - approx. 16:40 – Main Ring - Area Trial

Rule 293. Table A9. Speed 375mpm. Start Height 1.50m.

For registered horses in Grades A & B to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior members. This competition may not be restricted to invited riders or limited to less than 40 entries.

Qualifies for: The Queen Elizabeth II Cup at the Royal International Horse Show. Numbers to qualify: The top 20 riders on the Area/International Trials points list, for the period April- September.

Points will be awarded to riders placed 6th= or higher in Area Trials on the following scale; riders placed equal will share equally the total points attributable to the combined placings (for example, four riders placed 4th equal receive: 8+4+2+0 divided by 4 = 3.5 points each).

1<sup>st</sup> 64 points

2<sup>nd</sup> 32 points

3<sup>rd</sup> 16 points

4<sup>th</sup> 8 points

5<sup>th</sup> 4 points

6<sup>th</sup> 2 points

Points are awarded to each rider as the result of his/her best six results on points in Area Trials held during the qualifying period. Visiting Members are eligible to compete in Area Trial competitions but will not be awarded points.

For the purposes only of calculating points, the placings of Visiting Members will be disregarded, and points will be awarded to the remaining competitors according to their adjusted placings once this has been done.

FEI tack rules apply with exception of Padded batons and Spurs which must comply with National rules 101.9 & 102.9. Standing martingales are permitted in line with rule 102.3.

### Class 4 - approx. 17:40 – Main Ring - Speed Stakes

Rule 306. Table C. Start Height 1.30m.

Open to registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate and Junior Members.

Qualifies for: The British Showjumping National Championships.

Qualifying period: 1st July-30th June.

Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify to the final. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round))

Prizes: 1st: £400.00, 2nd: £300.00, 3rd: £200.00, 4th: £150.00, 5th: £100.00, 6th: £75.00, Total: £1,225.00.

**Entry Fee = £50.00**

Saturday 30 May 2026

**Class 5** - approx. 11:45 – Main Ring - **Accumulator**

Rule 274, 274.5, 274.6. Table A. Speed 375mpm. Start Height 1.30m.

Open to Adult, Associate and Junior Members. The order of starting must be drawn.

This competition takes place over six, eight or 10 obstacles which are progressively more difficult. No combination obstacles are allowed. The progressive difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles, but also to the difficulty of the track.

Points are awarded as follows:

One point for obstacle No. 1 cleared, two points for No. 2, three points for No. 3 etc. with total of 21, 36 or 55 points. No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock downs are penalised as for Table A and any of these faults, including time faults, are converted into points and deducted from any jumping points scored.

In the event of equality of points for first place, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a shortened course, over obstacles that may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round.

This competition may also take place directly against the clock.

For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one part may be designated the Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, the points must be deducted from the total.

**Class 6** - approx. 12:05 - Arena 1 - **Grand Prix**

Table A9. Speed 375mpm. Start Height 1.45m.

For registered horses in Grades: A, B & C. Ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members who will be aged 12 years or over in the current calendar year.

**Pre-Entry**

Prizes: 1st: £1,500.00, 2nd: £1,000.00, 3rd: £750.00, 4th: £500.00, 5th: £350.00, 6th: £200.00, 7th: £200.00, Total: £4,500.00.
