ABOUT THE SHOW

Trawden Agricultural Show – Sunday 10th August 2025 – Trawden Recreational Ground, Trawden, Lancashire, BB8 8RR

TICKETING

All exhibitors will be required to have an e-ticket or wristband to gain entry to the show field. Adult exhibitors will receive an exhibitor's e-ticket to the showground per cattle entry, up to a maximum of 3 tickets. Additional prepaid e-tickets can be purchased at the time of class entry at £10 for adults (£14 on gate) and £6 for children aged 6 and over (£6 on gate). Children under 6 are admitted free of charge and do not require a ticket. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to bring a valid e-ticket or wristband with them on the day.

GENERAL REMARKS AND STRIPULATIONS

Exhibitors are responsible for complying with all regulations from all statutory bodies including all movement licenses and restrictions.

Throughout the duration of the show Stanley House Vets, Colne are the Society's on duty vets, should any cattle require emergency care by our named Vets, the exhibitor of that animal will be expected to cover this cost. Exhibitors enter the show field at their own risk.

The Trawden and District Agricultural Society and its members, secretary and directors accept no responsibility for any losses incurred on the show field. Exhibitors must have Public Liability Insurance which covers which covers them when away from the holding.

We also reserve the right to cancel any classes or indeed the show, should abandonment be necessary. Refunds will not be made.

Should your vehicle/s and/or equipment require towing onto/ from the show field in the event of inclement weather, the trustees, organising committee, nor any of their servants, be held responsible for any loss, injury or damage sustained by the applicants, their property, or their assistants. The Society accepts no liability whatsoever and should the applicant not agree to the terms then they will be left to organise their own entrance/exit onto the show field, except in the event that your vehicle is causing an obstruction to other traffic or a show entrance or exit and cannot be moved by you within a very short time frame to allow the free flow of traffic again. In these circumstances the society will be permitted to move the vehicle by whatever means necessary and subject to causing as little damage as possible to the vehicle but will accept no liability for any damage as a result of the same.

CLASS INFORMATION

According to the British Cattle Movement Service (BCMS) All cattle must be accompanied to and from the Show by their cattle passport duly completed. Cross-checking of ear numbers may be carried out whilst animals are on the showground. The showground will do a same day movement for all cattle on and off the showground holding, you will be responsible for the movement off your holding and back onto your holding. (Trawden Show Holding No: **21/698/8001**).

Passports will need to be handed in to be signed and dated by the Cattle Secretary and a barcode label will be attached.

Note: Any cattle born after 1st July 1996 require a Passport. It must accompany the animal at all times – this will be filled in as if going to a market – stamped by the show and then returned home.

The TB testing exemption covering cattle movements to agricultural shows was revised on 1st July 2012 as follows:

Pre-movement testing of cattle in high TB risk herds (i.e., herds with a routine TB testing interval of 1 or 2 years) will be required for movements to show if cattle will be at the show for more than 24 hours and/or housed i.e., kept inside at the showground.

Previously, pre-movement testing was not required when animals were moved to shows provided, they were either returned to the farm of origin or went to slaughter after the show. The exemption will remain for movements to show where cattle are not held for more than 24 hours and are not housed.

A clear pre-movement test is valid for 60 days from the date of the test. Therefore, animals can be moved to more than one show during that post-test period provided that the last movement back to the home premises – or to slaughter, if applicable – is completed within 60 days of the test date.

Owners must ensure they do not book a TB test to take place within 60 days of completion of the previous TB test as this will not be regarded as an authorised test. Trawden Agricultural Show cannot be held responsible in regard to TB testing, it is up to the exhibitor to ensure correct procedures have been followed.

From 2016 Post Movement TB Testing has been introduced in certain circumstances. Trawden Agricultural Show is not currently affected as the cattle are not on the showground for more than 24 hours and are not housed in a building with sides on. We are therefore exempt from pre and post-movement testing. Please note Agricultural Show is not responsible if these circumstances change.

Livestock Tampering

Any artificial contrivance or device of any description found on or proved to have been used on an animal at any time whilst that animal is in the Showground, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purpose, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize, and any prize awarded prior to discovery will be forfeited. The Instigator or The Owner of the said animal may be prohibited from again entering Stock for any of the Society's Shows, for such period as the Committee may see fit.

For the purpose of this Regulation, the term 'improper practice' shall be held to include setting of teats, and generally, any other practice including tampering or of their own or any other animal by the exhibitor or any other person which results in the animals being shown other than in a natural state, and the Society reserves the right to have all animals inspected by the Society's Veterinary Officers, either prior to, during, or after judging. The Society will not tolerate the administration to show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquilisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question to have the effect of making it behave in the show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Society reserves the right to take any necessary samples. Any Person or Exhibitor (or his representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such

tranquilliser or drugs to any Show exhibit will be reported to the Organising Committee and dealt with at their discretion. In addition, the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

Throughout the duration of the show Stanley House Vets, Colne are the Society's on duty vets, should any animal require emergency care by our named Vets, the exhibitor of that animal will be expected to cover this cost.

Any Exhibitor wishing to lodge an objection, having reference to Livestock exhibited at this Show, must make the same in accordance with the objection requirements of the Society. If, on investigation, the objection is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Committee, the sum thus deposited shall, at the discretion of the Committee, be forfeited to the funds of the Society. All objections must be lodged on the same day as the alleged incident occurred in accordance with the objection regulations, and no objection will be SUBSEQUENTLY received, unless a reason, satisfactory to the Committee, be assigned for the delay.

Children should not be allowed to handle bulls or any large, fractious animal. An adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty maintaining control of any animal. The advice in the Approved Code of Practice "Preventing Accidents to Children in Agriculture" should be followed at all times.

Other Information

- No substitutions in Cattle Classes.
- All cattle will be undercover.
- The Society reserves the right to amalgamate, split or cancel classes due to insufficient entries. Judging times are approximate and are subject to change on the day.
- All animals being exhibited must have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor on Show Day. Certificates will be required if necessary.
- The Society reserve the right to transfer young stock cutting further teeth between the date of entry and date of the Show to appropriate class, subject to the satisfaction of both the Judge, Section Secretary and show manager.
- Cows/heifers calving at the Show or showing abnormal discharge or which appear to be about to abort, must be reported to the Veterinary Officer and returned to herd of origin immediately. All charges incurred must be paid for by the exhibitor
- Bull exhibitors should acquaint themselves with the Health and Safety Regulations Guidance Note GS36 regarding the handling of bulls at agricultural shows. Any animal thought to be unsafe for the general public will not be allowed into the cattle tents. The Steward's decision is final.
- All animals will be checked for their halters being on correctly. Any animal found to be incorrectly haltered will not be allowed to enter the ring. Exhibitors must ensure that their animals are properly halter trained before the Show. Any entry thought to be unsafe for the general public will be asked to leave the ring. The Steward's decision is final.
- All bulls aged 9 months and over must have a ring through their nose.
- During the period the Show is open to the public, NO STOCK should be left unattended.

There will be free refreshments available to exhibitors in the Cattle Secretary's tent.

PLEASE NOTE:

Strictly NO vehicles without livestock trailers will be permitted in the livestock areas

1st and 2nd Prize Winners MUST parade for Championship

DAIRY INTERBREED CHAMPIONSHIP

Judge: Liz Hoggarth, Sedbergh

Winners of Championships in Pedigree Holstein Friesian and Native Dairy Breeds to compete for the Trawden Show Trophy and £50 prize money – Reserve champion to be awarded reserve champion sash and £25 prize money.

YOUNGSTOCK HANDLER

Judge: Elizabeth Haughan, Penrith, Cumbria

Open to all breeds. Children should have assisted in the preparation of the animal. In the case of suckled calves, dams can be lined up down one side of the ring but may not be paraded with the calf.

Judges award 50% for the ability of the handler and 50% for the presentation of both handler and calf. Points will not be awarded for confirmation of the animal. Rosettes to all entrants.

C40. Handler who has not yet reached his/her 7th birthday showing a calf born this year.

**** An adult handler may be present to assist in this class if required.**

C41. Handler aged 7 years and over but not having reached their 10th birthday showing a calf born this year.

Winners of each class to compete for the JF Waite Championship Trophy and Champion rosette. Reserve champion to receive reserve champion rosette.

YOUNG FARMERS SECTION

Judge: Elizabeth Haughan, Penrith, Cumbria

Judging to follow on from young handlers

Open to all breeds. Exhibitors must be a member of any YFC and should have prepared the animal for exhibition themselves. Classes will be judged on 50% for the presentation and handling in the ring and 50% for observed preparation before the class. Points will not be awarded for the confirmation of the animal. Rosettes to all entrants. No bulls are to be shown in the YFC classes.

Please make sure that the birth date of the entrant is stated clearly on the entry form as the class may be split.

C42. Handler aged 10 years and over but not having reached their 16th birthday showing an animal born before 1st Jan 2025.

C43. Handler aged 16 years and over but not having reached their 21st birthday showing an animal over 12 months old.

C44. Handler aged 21 years and over but not having reached their 27th birthday showing an animal over 12 months old.

Winners of each classes C42 to C44 to compete for the Frank Jenkinson Shield, champion rosette and £20 prize money. Reserve champion receives the Abigail Guy Memorial Trophy, reserve champion rosette and £10 prize money.
