Trawden Agricultural Show – Sunday 10th August 2025 – Trawden Recreational Ground, Trawden, Lancashire, BB8 8RR

TICKETING

All exhibitors will be required to have an e-ticket or wristband to gain entry to the show field. For £5 worth of entries, one exhibitors ticket will be given. Additional prepaid e-tickets can be purchased at the time of class entry at £10 for adults (£14 on gate) and £6 for children aged 6 and over (£6 on gate). Children under 6 are admitted free of charge and do not require a ticket. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to bring a valid e-ticket or wristband with them on the day.

NEW GROWERS

RULES

- 1. All exhibits must have been the property of the exhibitor and grown in his or her care for at least 3 months prior to the show.
- 2. The committee reserves the right to inspect gardens from which exhibits have been entered, before and after the show.
- 3. Two or more people may not exhibit from the same garden in the same class (except children).
- 4. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 5. No exhibitor will be awarded more than two prizes in any one class.
- 6. Any prize may be with-held or modified if the exhibits are considered unworthy by the judges.
- 7. Any protest must be made in writing and delivered to the secretary of the section.
- 8. After judging, no exhibit may be removed or modified until 4.30pm.
- 9. All exhibits, private property etc. shall be at the risk of the exhibitor and the society shall not be liable for loss or damage, from any cause whatsoever.
- 10. The trophies remain the property of the society, to be held by the winner for one year and returned to the society before the next show.
- 11. Matters arising, not covered by the above, will be dealt with by the show committee.

FAMILY TROPHY

This trophy & large rosette will be awarded to the family (minimum one parent, one child - grandparents and other family members are also included) gaining most prizes across Adult & Children sections of the show. There will also be a large rosette for the 2nd place family

VEGETABLES

- H1. Trug/tray (less than 15 inches) of home grown produce. Minimum 4 varieties, staged for effect as well as quality.
- H2. 3 courgettes with flowers (10-15cm)
- H3. 3 long or stump carrots with trimmed tops.
- H4. 5 stems of rhubarb.
- H5. 3 onions 250g or less.
- H6. 3 onions to exceed 250g
- H7. 4 potatoes white
- H8. 4 potatoes coloured
- H9. 5 standard tomatoes
- H10. 1 truss of cherry tomatoes, ripe or green
- H11. 1 marrow
- H12. 6 pods of the same variety of any type of pea
- H13. 6 pods of any type of bean
- H14. A chilli plant
- H15. 1 brassica with guard leaves (E.g. cauliflower, cabbage, broccoli)
- H16. 3 of any other type of root vegetable with tops and roots (E.g.beetroot, radishes, turnips)
- H17. 1 of any type of fruit vegetable (cucumber, pepper)
- H18. Any other type of vegetable not mentioned above
- H19. 3 vases of culinary herbs, 1 kind each vase
- H20. Humorous vegetable class a vegetable that has gone wrong!
