ABOUT THE SHOW

Trawden Agricultural Show – Sunday 10th August 2025 – Trawden Recreational Ground, Trawden, Lancashire, BB8 8RR

TICKETING

All exhibitors will be required to have an e-ticket or wristband to gain entry to the show field. Additional prepaid e-tickets can be purchased at the time of class entry at £10 for adults (£14 on gate) and £6 for children aged 6 and over (£6 on gate). Children under 6 are admitted free of charge and do not require a ticket. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to bring a valid e-ticket or wristband with them on the day.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. **Entries** – officially close at **10.00 pm on** and should be on the official entry form, if at all possible. Entries for Juniors can be accepted by post, email or telephone. You can download forms from the TDAS website. No late entries can be **guaranteed** entry, but every effort will be made to deal with late entries or changes for Juniors. If **late entries are accepted**, they will not be listed in the Show Catalogue due to printing deadlines.
2. **Exhibits** - must be the work of the entrant and made in the 12 months prior to the Show. The Secretary may challenge whether the entry has essentially been made by the child. No kits are accepted as entries. The entrant must be the appropriate age for each class on Show Day.
3. **HELP!** Younger children may need a little help with some parts of their entries, for example, if sharp tools or heat are needed. **But it is their entry, not yours.** If you have essentially made something for them, please enter it into the **Adult crafts** – you know you want to!
4. **Delivery** – Any particularly large items or multiple entries, for example school or group entries, may be collected or delivered by prior arrangement. All entries must be brought to the Junior Section marquee on the Showground, and labelled and benched, either: **a) between 5.00 pm and 6.00 pm on Saturday 9th August 2025,** or **b) before 9.30 am on Show Day, Sunday 10th August 2025.**
5. **Entry Fee** – there is **no entry fee** for any Junior entry, and there is **no free entry** to the Show for Junior entrants. Remember to wear your wristband on the Showground.
6. **Labelling** – the name of the entrant must not be visible on any entry. Every entry must have an entry number securely attached to it before being left in the Junior marquee. The numbers will be available from the Secretary in the marquee at the times at number 4 above.
7. **Judging** – will begin at 10.00 am and the marquee will be closed during judging. The judges' decisions are final.
8. **Prizes** – Rosettes and certificates will be awarded to 3rd place in each class. Extra places may be awarded at the judges' discretion. Rosettes will be awarded for each Best in Section, Trawden Celtic Challenge, the Best in Show, and Most Individual Points. Any trophies will be awarded and presented to winners in the marquee at 4.00 pm.
9. **Family Cup** – will be awarded to the family (minimum one parent, one child: grandparents and other family members are also included) gaining most points across Junior, Adult Crafts and Horticulture Sections. Family members with full names and relationship **must** be listed on the Junior entry form. There will be a Rosette awarded to the 2nd Family. Points will be counted as follows: 1st = 3 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point, Best in Section = 1 point, Best in Show = 1 point.
10. **Removal of exhibits** – exhibits may be removed after 4.15 pm on Show Day.
11. **Trophies** – must be kept in good condition and returned to the Section Secretary or to Hedgehogs Florists prior to Trawden Show 2026.

FAMILY TROPHY

This trophy & large rosette will be awarded to the family (minimum one parent, one child - grandparents and other family members are also included) gaining most prizes across Adult & Children sections of the show. There will also be a large rosette for the 2nd place family

OPEN CLASSES

- C21. Make an **Island** – we shall provide a blue cloth 'sea' to put them onto. If you were a pirate or an explorer or an artist, what would you like to find on your island? Make it so that, whatever shape it is, it would sit on an A4 piece of paper.
- C22. Make a **Number**. You can use any art or craft at all to make a number – any number. It could be the number of your house, or your age, or your lucky number, or the year, or the total of all the ages in your house. You could make it out of wood, or material, or junk, or a hand print – whatever you want to use.
- C23. Make a **Mobile** using natural things, for example, twigs, flowers, feathers, pine cones. You can use string, ribbons, wool etc to hang things.
- C24. Make a **Theatre Set**. What is the play – a famous one, or one you'd like to write or see? Where is it? What furniture is in it? Do you want to put actors in it?
- C25. Write a **Short Story** on one side of A4 – with just words, or with your own illustrations, or as a comic strip. The opening sentence for the story is: "Trawden Show was going so well this year, until" Remember to put your name and age **on the back**.

FLOWER ARANGING

- C26. A **Bookmark** made using pressed flowers.
- C27. Make a table display for a **Farmer's Birthday**. You can put in all sorts of things that they might use on the farm, or animals, or crops, so long as your flowers have enough water to be happy in the Show Tent for the day.

For reasons of space, please enter unmounted photographs that are no larger than 7" x 5" or metric equivalent.

BAKING

We appreciate that young children need help with some aspects of baking, particularly where knives and ovens are concerned. Please let them do as much as possible, however, from choosing what to do, to measuring, mixing, tasting and decorating.

- C34. **5 and Under**. Jelly, layered in a glass. Different colours – add edible things into the jelly.
- C35. **6 to 8**. Animal bread rolls to be judged for look and taste. You can use any bread recipe or flour mixture, but make it an obvious animal shape.
- C36. **9 to 12**. Animal bread rolls to be judged for look and taste. You can use any bread recipe or flour mixture, but make it an obvious animal shape.
- C37. **13 to 16**. 6 pieces of fudge to be judged for look and taste. You can choose any flavour (as long as it's edible, please).
- C38. **Open**. Decorate 4 digestive biscuits. Judged for looks only.

TRAWDEN CELTIC CHALLENGE

- C39. Under 8.** Choose any of the classes in any of the sections above – Ages, Open, Flower arranging, Photography or Baking – and create your entry in the Celtic colours of **black and white**. You might take a black and white photo, or draw in charcoal, or finish your baking with food colouring or icing. Use your imagination and celebrate your club!
- C40. 9 to 16.** Choose any of the classes in any of the sections above – Age, Open, Flower arranging, Photography and Baking – and create your entry in the Celtic colours of **black and white**. You might take a black and white photo, or draw in charcoal, or finish your baking with food colouring or icing. Use your imagination and celebrate your club!
