**No late entries** – entries received after **FRIDAY 18 AUGUST 2023** will not be accepted. This rule will be strictly enforced. Please help and send your entry early. No refunds will be given following close of entries.

All exhibitors are asked to take careful note of the various starting times of their classes. No substitutions allowed (except Show Jumping).

There are **NO OVERNIGHT** parking facilities for horses on the Showground in the light horse parking area (Gate J). Should overnight facilities be required please contact the Show Office for details of alternative facilities on the Showground and/or local stabling.

Gates to the light horse parking area (Gate J) will not open until 6.00am.

**PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR:** This applies to all ridden competitions, jumping, demonstrations, practice, collecting areas and whilst exercising. All riders of horses or ponies on the Showground or exercise areas are required to wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats which conforms to the following standards for head protection for equestrian activities: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards; Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your Society/Association Rule Book for further clarification.

For the health and safety of all exhibitors, horses must not be tied to the side of Horse Boxes or Barriers. No Dogs or Pushchairs in Horse Walkways.

Numbers of entries per class will be posted on Westmorland County Agricultural Society website and Facebook page from 8 September 2023.

Classes will not be delayed for any reason.

**EQUINE WELFARE** is of paramount importance and all riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks, the Society reserves the right to take further action against any competitor whose size or weight compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden; this would be based on the recommendations of the on-site Animal Welfare Officer. Unless stipulated otherwise under breed society rules, untrimmed whiskers and ear hair will not be penalised by the Judge.

**EXHIBITOR PASSES**: will be despatched no later than 1 September 2023.

Exhibitor passes to be issued on the basis of 1 pass per horse/rider combination plus one pass for the exhibitor, to a maximum 5 passes per exhibitor. Exhibitors may apply for additional passes at the discounted rate of £14.00, subject to being purchased on or before the closing date for entries. Maximum 4 extra passes per exhibitor. All

exhibitor passes are non-refundable and no refunds or replacements will be given in respect of any lost, forgotten or unused passes.

### **Equine Influenza Policy**

Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 - 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 - 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

Horses must have been vaccinated within 12 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

Foals - in-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians.

Please note that neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office prior to the event. However, random checks will be carried out on the showground during the show.

### **RIDDEN HORSE SECTION**



#### Wednesday 13 September 2023

**Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB)** – This Show is affiliated to SHB. All exhibitors (ie owners, riders and horses) in Classes 17-23 & 25 must be registered with Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain and must be on 2023 show hunter register, competitors must quote their registration numbers on the entry form. Day Ticket = £36 per day ticket (2 day tickets are allowed per season). The day ticket covers owner & rider membership together with horse registration for that one show. If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

Classes 8, 11–14 are held under the rules of the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain but are not affiliated to Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. Please note the SHB(GB) rules relating to attire for grooms – It is the responsibility of exhibitors to ensure that grooms entering the Show Ring are smartly and professionally turned out. Grooms must wear a hat when in the ring, if not they will be asked to leave the ring.

Classes 17-23 & 25 Headwear - see general rules.

All Hunter Classes will be judged under SHB 2023 rules. The 2023 SHB Rule Book is available at the Stewards' marquee or downloaded from SHB www.sporthorsegb.co.uk.

#### SHB (GB) IN THE NORTH WEST - RIDDEN POINTS COMPETITION

The following classes at the show: WORKING HUNTER; RIDDEN SPORT HORSE; RIDDEN HUNTER; RIDDEN IRISH DRAUGHT, are included in the SHB(G.B) in the North West Ridden Points Competition. Points will be awarded to  $1^{st} - 4^{th}$  places in each class. Horses can compete in any of the above classes. An award will be made to the horse attaining the highest number of points overall. To qualify horses that are not registered at the time of the show must be registered or over stamped with SHB by 30 September 2023.

**UK Horses & Ponies** - The Society is affiliated to UK Horses & Ponies (UKPH) for the 2023 Season – Affiliation number 24/A18/8319 This Show is a qualifier for the UKPH Spring Classic 2024, Equifest 2024 & BSPA 2024. The 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in each qualifying class will qualify. No Membership required in order to compete in the final. Competitors should refer to UKPH for Rules & Regulations.The following qualifiers apply: Class 9 – UKPH Ridden Cob Gold Medal Series (A14); Class 10– UKPH Riding Horse Gold

Medal Series (A15); Classes 1-4 – UKPH Open Hunter Gold Medal Series (A19); Classes 6 & 7 – UKPH Amateur Riders Gold Medal Series (A17).

**British Show Horse Association –** The Society is affiliated to British Show Horse Association and the Show is held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Available to amateur members and nonmembers, please see Rule 6A-C in 2023 BSHA Rulebook. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any BSHA class at Horse of the Year Show Finals (including all Hunter Sections, Working Hunters & Ladies Side Saddle) (not including SFAS or SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed as an adult in any classes at Horse of the Year Show in the current season and two years prior. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Finals at Hickstead (excluding the current season). Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 14 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down the line. No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes. JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes. The Judges decision is final

**Irish Draught Horse Society (GB)** - This Society is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and only horses registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible for entry. The owners of all pure bred Irish Draught horses in ridden classes must be full members of the IDHS (GB). Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility.

All competing Stallions must be the progeny of a graded mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB) AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) by a Class 1 or Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion and be inspected or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2. They must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails. All riders of stallions must be 18 years of age or over. All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

#### Entry Fee: Classes 1 – 9 All entries £30 per entry, to include levy.

**Class 1 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Hack Type** Small and Large Hack: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 160cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Hack Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

- Class 2 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Riding Horse type Small Riding Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Small Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- Class 3 BSHA LIHS Rising Star Large Riding Horse Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms. The highest placed

unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Large Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

- Class 4 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Ridden Cob type Lightweight Cob Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- Class 5 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Ridden Cob type Heavyweight Cob Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Heavyweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- Class 6 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Ridden Cob type Maxi Cob Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- Class 7 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Ridden Hunter type Small/Lightweight Hunter Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed exceeding 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- Class 8 BSHA LIHS Rising Star of Ridden Hunter type Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- Class 9 BSHA LIHS Rising Star Ladies Show Horse Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms, suitable to carry a side saddle, to be ridden by a lady. Open to all Hacks, Cobs, Riding Horses and Hunters. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Ladies Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
- **Classes 1-9** If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than fifth place.

The Amateur classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days in order to confirm qualification.

#### JUDGES:

Ride & Conf: Mr P Langrick, Tollerton

This Show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and only horses registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible for entry. The owners of all pure bred Irish Draught horses in ridden classes must be full members of the

IDHS (GB). Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility.

All competing Stallions must be the progeny of a graded mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB) AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) by a Class 1 or Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion and be inspected or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2. They must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails. All riders of stallions must be 18 years of age or over. All ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

**Irish Draft Horse Society (GB)** - This show is a qualifier for the IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge. The highest placed horses (not already qualified) from each of the above/following.

Classes 14 – 16 will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show in 2024 (31 August-2 September 2024 Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire, CV23 8AJ). A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team. ### **Conditions of Competition**

- 1. The Exhibitor must in all cases be the owner of the animal shown (see Rule 23).
- The ENTRY LIST for all entries will close on FRIDAY 18 AUGUST 2023. No late entries will be accepted. Poultry, Alpacas, Livestock, Showjumping & Lowland Flocks excepted.
- 3. No animal can be shown in more than one Class, nor shall one animal take more than one Prize. Group and Special Prizes and Light Horses excepted.
- 4. Bulls must be led and ringed at the nose. Animals entering the showground area, in all respects, are at the risk of the owner. The Society will not be responsible for any accident which may occur through any animal exhibited, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. You are strongly advised to check your insurance cover on this point.
- 5. All Prizewinners in the Cattle Classes must take part in the Parade of Prize Animals or the Prizes will be withheld.
- 6. In order to discourage frivolous protests, every protest must be made in writing and sent to the Secretary within seven clear days after the date of the Show, and to be accompanied by a deposit of £50 to be returned, or retained, by the vote of the Committee, on consideration as to whether there was reasonable ground or not for the protest.
- 7. The Conditions attached to any Premium are applicable to all animals gaining a prize of whatever denomination.
- 8. If only one entry is received in any section, this section may be withdrawn. The entrant will be notified and the entry fee returned.
- 9. The winners of Cups, Trophies and/or Plaques must return them to the Society's office at Lane Farm on or before 1<sup>st</sup> July within the year following the Show, or in default of this requirement a penalty of £25 will be imposed. These cups, etc, shall be the responsibility of the winner until they are in the hands of the Society or its appointed Jeweller. Proof of posting will be required if an article is lost or alleged to be lost in the post.
- 10. All cups should be considered to be 'perpetual' unless stated otherwise.
- 11. All exhibitors will be subject to the orders of the Society's officials. Abuse, physical or verbal, towards stewards and staff will not be tolerated and exhibitors or their assistants not obeying the directions of the Society's officers will render themselves liable to expulsion from the Showground.
- 12. In the event of what is considered by the Management Committee to be a serious contravention of the Rules, not apparent within the 7-day period under condition 6, the 7-day period need not apply.
- 13. A Disciplinary Committee consisting of the Referee, Chairman, Show Secretary and appropriate Chief Steward is empowered to represent the Society on matters relating to the Show on Show day and their decision shall be binding.
- 14. All persons entering an animal in a class covered by a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to it's Rules and disciplinary procedures including exclusion from exhibiting.

### **Extract from Rules of Society**

- 1. This Society, established in 1799, for the purpose of improving the breed of stock and the management and cultivation of farms has for its objects the promotion of the interests of Agriculture in general and to combine and foster the interests of town and country.
- 5.1 Applicants for membership, having paid the current membership subscription, shall on Show Day have the rights and privileges of a member (save voting rights until voting membership is confirmed) and shall otherwise be bound by the rules bylaws and regulations of the Society for the time being.
- 7. Every subscriber of £45.00 a year and upwards may apply to be a Member of the Society. Subscriptions shall become due and paid by Show Day in each year, and any person whose application has not been approved shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting. No member shall be allowed to withdraw his name without giving notice in writing to the Show Secretary of his intention to do so previous to the 1st December in each year.
- 13. All conditions of competition framed by the Committee shall be as binding as these Rules, providing the same be in no way at variance therewith.
- 23. When a Premium or Prize is offered for any animal without expressing that it be in the hands of the Breeder such animal shall have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and located upon their premises for a period of not less than three calendar months immediately preceding the Show Day. Horses, sheep and pigs excepted.
- 24. No person (except in the case of a son succeeding his father, a widow her husband) shall be admitted to claim for the best managed farm until he has been in bona-fide occupation of such farm for three years at least. The Inspectors in making their awards shall have special regard to the improvements made by the Tenant as distinguished from those made by the Landlord.
- 25. If a person shall obtain a First Prize in any of the Farms and Stocks classes (classes 1–11) for two consecutive years, he shall not be entitled to compete again for the same Prize in the year immediately succeeding the date of the second award; and whenever such person shall again become a competitor, the inspectors shall direct their attention particularly to the improvements made on the farm during the last two years.
- 26. The word 'Farm' shall mean the entire holding or holdings of the competitor, being either proprietary occupier or tenant, when lying together or farmed from the same homestead, exclusive of woods, roads, rivers and high-lying grounds not adapted for ploughing, and whether or not farmed under different landlords or held under different agreements.

**N.B.** Inasmuch as it is impossible to frame this Rule so as to meet every case, the Committee shall have power, in the event of dispute to decide each case on its own merits, but in accordance as far as possible with the true intent and spirit of this Rule, and their decisions shall be final.

30. Any member knowingly making any false entry, or otherwise attempting to impose on the Society, shall not be allowed to continue as a member.
