GENERAL

- All entries must be made on the Show's printed form, or online, and be accompanied by the appropriate remittance for the classes entered.
- Members of the Society and Subscribers paying £45.00 or more will receive a badge which gives admission to the Show and to the Members' Terrace.
- 3. The Westmorland County Agricultural Society privacy policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, that you provide to us or that we may receive from others about you will be processed by us. It includes data that we hold electronically and in paper files. Names, limited address particulars and details of entries will be published in the catalogue of entries and passed to our printers, solely for the purpose of compiling the catalogue. Results information may be published (in printed form and online) and provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information relating to Exhibitors and their animals may be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA), British Cattle Movement Service (BCMS), SAC, Breed Societies, County Councils, Veterinary Advisors and others who have regulatory access. Please refer to www.westmorlandshow.co.uk for full details of our Privacy Policy.
- No late entries The Show Secretary has strict instructions not to accept any entries received after the respective closing date: Light Horse Tuesday 19th August 2025.
- 5. All classes are open with no radius restriction, unless otherwise stated.
- All exhibitors agree to abide by Rules and Conditions quoted by submitting their Official Entry Form.
- 7. The Judging of all Classes will commence at the stated times.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION/CERTIFICATES

- 8. No animal will be allowed in any Ring, unless the proper numbered card is attached to each exhibit with string or similar.
- 9. Show Numbers will be posted with tickets etc. early September.
- 10. Certificates/movement permits should be made available in all appropriate cases.

FULL MEMBERSHIP TO THE SOCIETY

11. The above reference to Members and Subscribers of £45.00 or more relates to those individuals who wish to take temporary membership of the Society for Show Day only. Full membership of the Society is open to applicants who are proposed by an existing full member, who has paid the appropriate subscription and who has been approved by the Management Committee of the Society. Applications must be made in the manner prescribed and applicants may enjoy the privileges of Members' facilities on Show Day but may not vote until their membership is confirmed and they shall be bound by the rules, bylaws and regulations of the Society for the time being. Applications for full membership should be made to the Show Secretary. The Membership year runs from 1st April to 31st March.

EXHIBITOR TICKETS

12. Exhibitor passes to be issued on the basis of 1 horse = 2 passes, 2 horses = 3 passes, 3 horses = 4 passes etc. Exhibitors may apply for additional passes at the discounted rate of £14.00, subject to being purchased on or before the closing date for entries. Maximum 4 extra passes per exhibitor. All exhibitor passes are non-refundable and no refunds or replacements will be given in respect of any lost, forgotten or unused passes.

EQUINE INFLUENZA POLICY

13. Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 – 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 – 215 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose.

Horses must have been vaccinated within 12 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

Foals - in-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians.

Please note that neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office prior to the event. However, random checks will be carried out on the showground during the show.

EQUINE WELFARE

14. Equine welfare is of paramount importance and all riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks, the Society reserves the right to take further action against any competitor whose size or weight compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden; this would be based on the recommendations of the on-site Animal Welfare Officer. Unless stipulated otherwise under breed society rules, untrimmed whiskers and ear hair will not be penalised by the Judge.

All exhibitors are asked to take careful note of the various starting times of their classes. No substitutions allowed (except Show Jumping).

There are **no overnight** parking facilities for horses on the Showground in the light horse parking area (Gate J). Should overnight facilities be required please contact the Show Office for details of alternative facilities on the Showground and/or local stabling.

Location: The Light Horse section, including rings and parking, will be held in the Equine fields at the County Showground. Please follow signage and refer to the exhibitor map prior to the Show. Gates to the light horse parking area (Gate J) will not open until **6.00am**.

For the health and safety of all exhibitors, horses must not be tied to the side of Horse Boxes or Barriers. No Dogs or Pushchairs in horse walkways.

Society Rules and Qualifications

Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB)

This Show is affiliated to SHB (GB). All exhibitors (ie owners, riders and horses) in Classes RH1-RH7, WH5 & WH6 must be registered with Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain and must be on 2025 show hunter register, competitors must quote their registration numbers on the entry form. Day Ticket = £42 per day ticket (2 day tickets are allowed per season). The day ticket covers owner & rider membership together with horse registration for that one show. If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

Classes RH1-RH7, WH5 & WH6 Headwear – see general rules.

All Hunter Classes will be judged under SHB 2025 rules. The 2025 SHB Rule Book is available at the Stewards' marquee or downloaded from SHB www.sporthorsegb.co.uk.

Classes RH1-RH7, WH5 & WH6 are qualifiers for THE ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW, (RIHS) Hickstead 2026 Only horses registered on the 2025 Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society. Day ticket (see above). The two highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter at the RIHS. In the Working Hunter Classes the three highest placed horses will qualify. No horse lower than third in its class will qualify. In the Amateur hunter classes the lightweight section, the two highest placed smalls and the two highest placed lightweights will qualify and in the heavyweight section the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify. Judges must place all horses to determine qualifiers.

SHB (GB) IN THE NORTH WEST - RIDDEN POINTS COMPETITION

The following classes at the show: WORKING HUNTER; RIDDEN SPORT HORSE; RIDDEN HUNTER; RIDDEN IRISH DRAUGHT, are included in the SHB(G.B) in the North West Ridden Points Competition. Points will be awarded to 1st – 4th places in each class. Horses can compete in any of the above classes. An award will be made to the horse attaining the highest number of points overall. To qualify horses that are not registered at the time of the show must be registered or over stamped with SHB by 30 September 2025.

British Show Horse Association

The Society is affiliated to British Show Horse Association and the Show is held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. RISING STAR AMATEUR RULES FOR 2025

Open to members and pre-registered non-members, 15 yrs and over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules. Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2025 are separate from BSHA Amateur rules. Please see the separate Rising Star Rulebook in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website. https://britishshowhorse.org/bsha-rising-stars-series/ If you are in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly, to have your status confirmedClasses RS1-RS10, WH7, WH8 & RR3 qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify. A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

Open to members and non-members, 15 yrs & over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules.

Classes AM1-AM4 are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show, (RIHS) Hickstead 2026 Amateur Championships. The highest placed unqualified horse in each section in each class in the Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes will qualify for the RIHS Amateur final, with the two highest placed unqualified horses qualifying in the Maxi Cob class. The BSHA offer a Champion rosette to be awarded in the separate Amateur Championship. Please refer to rule 6A-C in the 2025 BSHA Rulebook. The Amateur classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days in order to confirm qualification.

Irish Draught Horse Society (GB)

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) All horses must be eligible under the below criteria to qualify:-

- Horses must be registered or overstamped with IDHS(GB) and be in the correct ownership
- . All owners or both pure bred and part bred horses must be full members of the Society
- Ridden horses must be over 153cm (15hh)
- All riders of stallions must be 18 year old or over

This show is a qualifier for the IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge. The highest placed horses (not already qualified) from each of the following.

Classes ID1,ID2, RH1-RH7, WH5 & WH6 will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS(GB) National Championship show in 2026 (date and venue to be confirmed as soon as possible on www.idhsgb.org.uk). A horse may only qualify for the final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Qualifiers will be contacted by a member of the IDHS Show Team.

In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, and a trophy the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, and the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50

BSPA Association

This Society is affiliated to the British Skewbald and Piebald Association. Classes BSP1-BSP4 will be judged under BSPA rules, download from www.bspaonline.com. Rider age is taken as 1st Jan. Membership of BSPA is not a requirement for classes BSP5-BSP9. For classes BSP1-BSP9 all stallions must be graded and licensed by BSPA and have a BSPA stallion ID card which must be carried at all times and produced on request. All stallions must wear a BSPA Stallion Disc. No rider under 14 yrs may exhibit a stallion in any class.

Membership and Qualification cards MUST be carried in the ring by competitors and produced as required for inspection or signature. Failure to do so will disqualify any competitor and their Qualification handed down to the next unqualified competitor as appropriate. Spurs may not be worn in any pony classes. Ponies 153cms or under (Shetlands exempt) must possess a current JMB height certificate. RIHS Schedules www.hickstead.co.uk. No lead reins.

Classes BSP1-BSP4 are qualifiers for THE ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW, Hickstead 2026. ALL horses must be registered with, and owners & rider's members of, BSPA prior to the Show. BSPA office: 01354 638226 (bspashows@gmail.com). Skewbald and Piebald Horse/ponies only.

Qualification: 1st place and the next unqualified competitor standing 2nd or 3rd qualify from each class. No competitor may qualify from lower than 3rd place.

Classes BSP5-BSP9 are qualifiers for the WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS OF COLOUR National Champion of Champions 2025, to be held at College Equestrian Centre, Keysoe, Bedfordshire in September, provided owners/handlers/riders are members of BSPA and Horses/Ponies are registered with BSPA prior to the Show, membership & qualification cards to be shown in the ring and signed at the time of qualification. However, membership is not a requirement for entry into these classes. Non-members will not qualify.

Classes BSP5-BSP8 -1^{st} - 3^{rd} qualify, plus h/p Youngstock and h/p Traditional or Native pony not standing 1^{st} - 3^{rd} . Class BSP9 -1^{st} - 3^{rd} qualify or 1^{st} - 4^{th} when class exceeds 12.

UK Horses & Ponies

The Society is affiliated to UK Horses & Ponies (UKPH) for the 2025 Season – Affiliation number 24/A18/8319. This Show is a qualifier for the UKPH Spring Classic 2026, Equifest 2026 & BSPA 2026. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each qualifying class will qualify. No Membership required in order to compete in the final. Competitors should refer to UKPH for Rules & Regulations. The following qualifiers apply: Classes BSP1-BSP4 – UKPH Ridden Skewbald/Piebald Horse/Pony Gold Medal Series (A21); Classes BSP5-BSP8 – UKPH In Hand Skewbald/Piebald Gold Medal Series (A02). UKPH Classes BSP5-BSP8 rule W20 applies – Open to Skewbald/Piebald horses/ponies non-native /native/Traditional Cob/Show Cob Type, stallion, mare, gelding, colt or filly, any height. Class MM7 – UKPH Ridden M&M Gold Medal Series (A04); Class MM8 – UKPH M&M First Ridden Gold Medal Series (A08); Class MM9 – UKPH M&M Lead Rein Gold Medal Series (A07). Classes WH6-WH7 – UKPH M&M WHP Gold Medal Series (A10); Class WHP17 – UKPH WHP Gold Medal Series (A13). (UK Horses & Ponies to allocate qualifiers)

TGCA

Classes are held under the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association Rules. Affiliation No 23/109/ULT. Open to non-members – No known breeding required to enter these classes.

Traditional of the Year (TOYS) – Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA) breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the TGCA National Breed Championships Show 'TOYS'. Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Stallions – all stallions (4 years and over), must be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over 2 years must be shown in a stallion bridle, with a metal bit and chain lead as per current TGCA rulebook. Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members that qualify should receive a non-members qualification card from the judge in the ring and have 21 days to join the TGCA to register their horse to validate the qualification.

Championships Quest for a Star Championship Inc Youngstock Quest for a Star - Traditional Gypsy Cobs 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule. ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship, if exhibit already has their Quest for a Star Qualification in particular section, they should be ask stand aside to allow members that have not yet qualified. Membership card and Member's qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

The Greatest Gelding Award The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level. This Award should be given to the highest-placed registered Traditional Gelding and Part Bred Gelding.

Go for Glory - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS. For TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championship at TOYS.

Veteran Horse Society

Classes are held under Veteran Horse Society Rules. All competitors must adhere to the VHS Rules in all circumstances, failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Riders must be suitable age/weight for size of horse/pony, minimum age of handler for in-hand classes is 9 years. Stallions in hand & ridden - competitors must be a minimum of 16yrs of age. No foals, spurs, galloping or wearing of face/body jewellery permitted. No advanced or extended movements/transitions. The age of Horse/Pony must be stipulated on the entry form. This Society is affiliated to VHS and these classes are open to Members and Non-Members. Those wishing to join or renew the Society will need to apply for this before 1st April each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge. Regional Finals are open to members only. All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships 4th – 6th September 2026. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season in 2026. For further information please visit the VHS website www.veteran-horse-society.co.uk or telephone the VHS Show Office on 01239 881300 or 07789 514004.

Shetland Pony Stud Book Society

Classes are confined to Shetland Pony Stud Book Society registered Ponies which must be named on the entry form. Society Rosettes will only be given to registered Ponies or Foals eligible for registration. Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on Show day. Stallions — entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS voluntary veterinary examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand entire males 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or stallions in In-hand classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 yrs or under in In-hand classes.

Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, & take no further part.

BSPS

These classes are open to non-BSPS members, however, this show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and all persons entering, competing, or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS, are subject to the constitution and rules of the BSPS, including their disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS. Riders will be required to adhere to rule 43 in the 2025 rulebook with regard to hat specification and tagging. BSPS Registered Number is BSPS 910/25. A copy of the constitution and rules is available upon request at the Stewards marguee on Show Day.

Riders in BSPS WHP classes are required to wear a body protector.

Lead rein classes must be shown in SNAFFLE BRIDLES only and the attendant MUST FIX THE LEAD REIN TO THE NOSEBAND. First ridden ponies must be shown in SNAFFLE BRIDLES only.

Also, a qualifier for the BSPS Thor Atkinson Steel Fabrications Ltd Challenge.

Competitors in BSPS Heritage M&M Open Classes will qualify for the BSPS Thor Atkinson Steel Fabrications Ltd Challenge.

1st prize-winners in classes MM1-MM9 will qualify for the BSPS Binks Family Champion of Champions.

Conditions of Competition

- 1. The Exhibitor must in all cases be the owner of the animal shown (see Rule 23).
- 2. The ENTRY LIST for all entries will close on TUESDAY 19 AUGUST 2025. No late entries will be accepted. Poultry, Alpacas, Livestock, Showjumping, Lowland/Upland Flocks & Gardens excepted.
- 3. No animal can be shown in more than one Class, nor shall one animal take more than one Prize. Group and Special Prizes and Light Horses excepted.
- 4. Bulls must be led and ringed at the nose. Animals entering the show-ground area, in all respects, are at the risk of the owner. The Society will not be responsible for any accident which may occur through any animal exhibited, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. You are strongly advised to check your insurance cover on this point.
- 5. All Prize winners in the Cattle Classes must take part in the Parade of Prize Animals or the Prizes will be withheld.
- 6. In order to discourage frivolous protests, every protest must be made in writing and sent to the Chief Executive within seven clear days after the date of the Show, and to be accompanied by a deposit of £50 to be returned, or retained, by the vote of the Committee, on consideration as to whether there was reasonable ground or not for the protest.
- 7. The Conditions attached to any Premium are applicable to all animals gaining a prize of whatever denomination.
- 8. If only one entry is received in any section, this section may be withdrawn. The entrant will be notified and the entry fee returned.
- 9. The winners of Cups, Trophies and/or Plaques must return them to the Society's office at Lane Farm on or before 1st July within the year following the Show, or in default of this requirement a penalty of £25 will be imposed. These cups, etc, shall be the responsibility of the winner until they are in the
 - hands of the Society or its appointed Jeweller. Proof of posting will be required if an article is lost or alleged to be lost in the post.
- 10. All cups should be considered to be 'perpetual' unless stated otherwise.
- 11. All exhibitors will be subject to the orders of the Society's officials. Abuse, physical or verbal, towards stewards and staff will not be tolerated and exhibitors or their assistants not obeying the directions of the Society's officers will render themselves liable to expulsion from the Showground.
- 12. In the event of what is considered by the Management Committee to be a serious contravention of the Rules, not apparent within the 7-day period under condition 6, the 7-day period need not apply.
- 13. A Disciplinary Committee consisting of the Referee, Chairman, Show Secretary and appropriate Chief Steward is empowered to represent the Society on matters relating to the Show on Show day and their decision shall be binding.
- 14. All persons entering an animal in a class covered by a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to its Rules and disciplinary procedures including exclusion from exhibiting.

Extract from Rules of Society

- This Society, established in 1799, for the purpose of improving the breed of stock and the management and cultivation of farms has for its objects the promotion of the interests of Agriculture in general and to combine and foster the interests of town and country.
- 5.1 Applicants for membership, having paid the current membership subscription, shall on Show Day have the rights and privileges of a member (save voting rights until voting membership is confirmed) and shall otherwise be bound by the rules bylaws and regulations of the Society for the time being.
- 7. Every subscriber of £45.00 a year and upwards may apply to be a Member of the Society. Subscriptions shall become due and paid by Show Day in each year, and any person whose application has not been approved shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting. No member shall be allowed to withdraw his name without giving notice in writing to the Show Secretary of his intention to do so previous to the 1st December in each year.
- 13. All conditions of competition framed by the Committee shall be as binding as these Rules, providing the same be in no way at variance therewith.
- 23. When a Premium or Prize is offered for any animal without expressing that it be in the hands of the Breeder such animal shall have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and located upon their premises for a period of not less than three calendar months immediately preceding the Show Day. Horses, sheep and pigs excepted.
- 24. No person (except in the case of a son succeeding his father, a widow her husband) shall be admitted to claim for the best managed farm until he has been in bona-fide occupation of such farm for three years at least. The Inspectors in making their awards shall have special regard to the improvements made by the Tenant as distinguished from those made by the Landlord.
- 25. If a person shall obtain a First Prize in any of the Farms and Stocks classes (classes 1–14) for two consecutive years, he shall not be entitled to compete again for the same Prize in the year immediately succeeding the date of the second award; and whenever such person shall again become a competitor, the inspectors shall direct their attention particularly to the improvements made on the farm during the last two years.
- 26. The word 'Farm' shall mean the entire holding or holdings of the competitor, being either proprietary occupier or tenant, when lying together or farmed from the same homestead, exclusive of woods, roads, rivers and high-lying grounds not adapted for ploughing, and whether or not farmed under different landlords or held under different agreements.
 - **N.B.** Inasmuch as it is impossible to frame this Rule so as to meet every case, the Committee shall have power, in the event of dispute to decide each case on its own merits, but in accordance as far as possible with the true intent and spirit of this Rule, and their decisions shall be final.
- 30. Any member knowingly making any false entry, or otherwise attempting to impose on the Society, shall not be allowed to continue as a member.


