1	A Banana Loaf Cake - set recipe	<p>Class 1 – Banana Loaf Cake</p> <p>Cake Ingredients –</p> <p>275g white self-raising flour</p> <p>1 level teaspoon baking powder</p> <p>1 teaspoon ground mixed spice</p> <p>100g soft, light brown sugar</p> <p>3 very ripe, medium bananas (approx 225g peeled weight)</p> <p>3 x large eggs</p> <p>150ml sunflower/vegetable oil</p> <p>Line and grease a 2lb loaf tin</p> <p>Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan</p> <p>Method –</p> <p>Peel the bananas and mash with a fork.</p> <p>Tip into large mixing bowl and add eggs, sugar and oil. Use a fork or whisk to combine.</p> <p>Add the flour, baking powder and mixed spice and whisk all together until thoroughly combined.</p> <p>Pour the mixture into the prepared cake tin and place in preheated oven for approx. 40 mins (test with a skewer) or until cake is well risen.</p> <p>Once baked, cool in tin for 10 mins and turn out.</p>

7	4 Chocolate Cookies - Set Recipe - President's Choice	<p>Class 7 - Chocolate Cookies</p> <p>Set Recipe</p> <p>Ingredients -</p> <p>125g unsalted butter</p> <p>100g light brown sugar</p> <p>100g white granulated sugar</p> <p>1 medium egg</p> <p>1 teaspoon vanilla extract</p> <p>25g cocoa powder</p> <p>225g plain flour</p> <p>1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda</p> <p>1/2 teaspoon baking powder</p> <p>1/2 teaspoon salt</p> <p>150g milk chocolate chips</p> <p>150g white chocolate chips</p> <p>Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan and line baking trays with parchment</p> <p>Method -</p> <p>Mix together the butter and both sugars until light and fluffy.</p> <p>Mix in the vanilla and egg until thoroughly combined.</p> <p>Add in the cocoa powder, plain flour, bicarb, baking powder and salt and mix until a thick paste/cookie dough is formed.</p>

Fold in the chocolate chips.
Portion and roll into approx. 24 balls and place onto trays to make sure they have room to spread!
Bake in the oven for 10-12 mins until spread out and crinkly.
Once baked, remove from oven and leave to cool fully.
