Congratulations on qualifying for the SEIB Search for a Star Championships at Your Horse Live on Friday 8th November 2024. We are really looking forward to seeing you in action!

ENTRIES ARE NOW OPEN!

Online entries only, postal will not be accepted.

Please read all information below about passes, stabling, hook up, bedding etc. You will find all the information you need to make your experience as smooth as possible, with your entry you will receive 3 x c petitor/rider/owner wristbands, a vehicle pass and stable information (if you have booked one). Extra passes for your supporters to watch your competition and enjoy the show can be brought, further information is below.

Arrival

Upon arrival at the show please make your way through the NAEC Main Gate (CV8 2LH) and follow the signs for *SEIB Search 4 A Star*, which will lead you down to your SEIB stable yard.

If arriving on <u>Thursday 8th November and you have booked a stable, please arrive between 15.00 - 19.00</u> where you will be greeted by a member of the SEIB team. Early arrivals may

be granted with prior consent but there is no guarantee the stables will be ready. If you think you will be arriving later please make us aware by calling Nicky MacKenzie 07973 791168.

Please ensure that you have all relevant documentation including horse passports, vaccination forms and passes needed. You cannot unload your horse until the vaccinations have been checked by the duty vet on site.

If you are coming for the day on Friday, <u>you must arrive between 06.30 - 08.00</u>. Please allow enough time to arrive, unload and get you and your horse down to the SEIB arena. Traffic can be very busy on the Friday, and it is a seven-minute walk for you and your horse to get to our SEIB Arena. You will need to be at the arena 10 minutes before your class starts and the classes can't be put on hold or delayed.

Hook-up

If you have booked a stable overnight, please use the stable with your name pinned to the door. Along with your £20 deposit in cash which will be returned when you leave if the stable has been signed off as clear.

Bedding will be provided free of charge within your stable by our official bedding supplier, Heavenly Bedding. Please note that this supply is limited and should this not be suitable for any reason you will need to bring your own. You are required to supply your own feed, hay and water buckets; we advise bringing a wheelbarrow too. **There is no electricity inside the stables, so we recommend that you bring a lighting source.**

If you have pre-booked a hook-up, then please refer to the plan on arrival to the stable yard where a space will be allocated for you (please use the one allocated to you). We recommend bringing a long hook up cable.

Stable blocks should be cleaned out into the temporary midden provided and stables left completely clear of droppings and all bedding. Please ensure you bring your own mucking out equipment as none will be available onsite. Please be aware that should you leave without clearing out the stable, your £20 cleaning deposit w

Entry Wristbands & Vehicle Passes

It is your responsibility to ensure wristbands are given to all personnel within your party as Security will not have spare passes at the entry gate.

Should you need to order extra visitor tickets for family or friends, use this link www.yourhorse.co.uk/yourhorselive and this discount code SEIBSFAS24. These will be sent by email in e-tickets form and will allow them entry into the show. These people will NOT need a vehicle pass as they will be required to park in the public car parks. Only the rider, owner and groom (3 named wristband wearers) will be allowed through to the back of the arena and stables.

Those that qualify for the Supreme on Saturday will be able to purchase extra services and passes onsite at the Organisers Office to accommodate the extra day should they wish. The rider, owner and groom will be given another wristband FOC for the Saturday.

Timetable

Please remember to give yourself time to walk down to the SEIB Arena (5-10 minute walk) and follow the signed horse walk (there is traffic around the site) it is important you are there 10 minutes early as if we are running ahead of time, the classes will run on if possible.

Exercising/Warm-up

The SEIB Main Arena is indoor, 60mx25m with tiered seating for 2000 on the long side with a large TV screen behind. The SEIB Arena will be open to all for exercise and for you to acclimatise yourself and your horse between 19.00-20.00 on Thursday evening and 07.00-to 7.55am on Friday morning, please see times above.

An outdoor working in arena is available but may be muddy if the weather is not good and this is out of our control.

ACCESS

On Thursday evening you will be escorted down with a vehicle in front and behind as it will be dark and there will be noise from stands still setting up

around the arena hall. On Friday we advise you to use this time to get your horses used to the arena.

Livestock

All equine livestock entering the show site must have received a complete course of Equine Influenza Vaccinations or a booster dose within the 12 months prior to the event. If your horse's vaccinations are not up to date, your horse will not be allowed on the premises. Passport checks will be conducted during the arrival times.

VET

The emergency vet number whilst onsite is 07572 231428 and the vet will be there between 07.00 – 18.00 each day. You will also find this number and the number of the on-duty vet on each end of the stable blocks – please ensure you take a note of these on arrival.

Emergency Veterinary Treatment

It is a condition of competing that you agree that the Veterinary Officers may, on their own authority, give to any animal such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate if the owner or his/her representative cannot immediately be found. Owners of animals receiving veterinary treatment administered by the Veterinary Officers must pay the full cost of treatment and services and certification administered by the Veterinary Officers attending the animals.

Insurance

Riders must hold relevant liability insurance.

Security

There will be a night security dog patrol around the venue and site at night, but they will not be directly in the stables themselves.

Security have been instructed to check wristbands every time you enter the Stable Yard, even if they recognise you. Please note this is to ensure the safety of your horses and to make sure that only the correct people are in this area. Please be patient with them and allow them to do their job.

If you are arriving on Thursday evening, please be aware that the rest of the show will still be in build and you won't be allowed access into any of the exhibition halls at this time.

Dogs

No dogs (assistance dogs excluded) are allowed onsite for the duration of the show.

Tips for Competitors and What to Expect by Class

Friday 8th November

In-Hand Championship for: Veteran, Native and Traditional, Mountain and Moorland, Plaited Pony, Plaited Horse / Show Cob

Handlers dress code – black or coloured trousers, boots, tweed jackets, shirt and tie, gloves and hard hat.

Animals to be exhibited in a bridle with a bit, with the lead rein attached to the bit using a coupler.

The class – the finalists will be invited into the ring, they will complete the goround in walk and then be invited by the steward to line up in groups according to the various types. Finalists will give a short show of their choice or follow the judge if a specific show is requested. Each show is to finish with a halt and salute in front of the judge. The steward will direct.

BRC Riding Club Championship

Dress code – riding helmets to Riding Club standards, back protectors optional, jacket appropriate to type of horse or pony.

The class - All competitors will be expected to complete a 'go round' in walk, trot and canter on each rein then each competitors will be required to give a short show of approximately 1 minute.

Pony Club First Ridden and Lead Rein Championship

The class – lead rein and first ridden finalists will enter the arena together and walk round once. Lead rein competitors will then be split whilst the first ridden competitors complete their go round in walk and trot on both reins. The first ridden's will carry out their individual shows.

First ridden shows are to be the same as at the qualifier Grooms wearing hard hats are encouraged to come into the ring as ponies will be stripped. It is expected that riders will trot their pony up. Once all the ponies have given shows and been stripped, the lead rein ponies will be asked back into the main arena and first ridden ponies will be asked to go to the holding area.

Grooms may accompany the first ridden's in the holding area.

Lead rein competitors will then complete their go round, in walk and trot before lining up and carrying out their individual shows. Lead rein shows are to be the same as the qualifier Lead rein ponies will have their conformation assessed by the judge, but they will not be stripped.

After the lead rein competitors have completed their shows, the first ridden's will be invited back into the main arena and both sections will walk round together before the winners are announced for each class and prizes presented.

Pony Club Open Ridden Championship

Dress code - riding helmets to Pony Club standards, back protectors optional, tweed jacket Pony Club tie and badge. Snaffle, simple double or pelham bridles are permitted. Snaffles will not be penalised.

The class – all competitors will be expected to complete a 'go round' in walk, trot and canter on each rein and give the same show as at the qualifier.

Grooms wearing hard hats are encouraged to come into the ring as ponies will be stripped. It is expected that riders will trot their horse or pony up.

Mountain and Moorland Ridden Championship

Dress code – a hard hat with a chin strap must be worn. It is expected that riders will wear a tweed jacket with shirt and tie. Snaffle, simple double or pelham bridles are permitted.

The class - all competitors will be expected to complete a 'go round' in walk, trot and canter on each rein. Shows are to be of the competitor's choice, approximately 1 minute long and to finish with a halt and salute in front of the judge. Grooms, wearing hard hats, are encouraged to come into the ring as animals will be stripped.

Open Veteran Ridden Championship

Dress code – championship dress.

The class - shows are to be of the competitor's choice, approximately 1 minute long to include lengthening of stride, and to finish with a halt and salute in front of the judge. Grooms, wearing hard hats, are encouraged to come into the ring as animals will be stripped. This class is a standalone championship so the winner will not be invited to the Saturday Supreme.

Saturday 11th November

12.45pm – Search for a Star Your Horse Live Supreme ChampionshipThe winner of each section on the Friday *except the Open Veteran class* will be invited to compete in the Search for a Star Your Horse Live Supreme championship on the Saturday in the main SEIB arena at Your Horse Live at 1pm.

In-hand competitors to wear – black trousers, boots, white shirt and hard hat. Ridden competitors should dress either as per their Friday class, or wear evening/championship dress – navy or black jacket and a stock, hard hat with a chin strap.
